

### Rector's Notes - OCTOBER 2019



### When Christians disagree...

I recently came across a fascinating address by Revd Sam Wells, vicar of St Martin in the Field Trafalgar Square, to the recent Inclusive Church conference on the subject of how to cope when Christians disagree about important matters.

There are several areas this might happen of course. At the time of writing Brexit is the most obvious, but human sexuality is another matter not yet settled in the Church of England, or it might simply be about things that should or should not happen in the life of our local church that we feel strongly about. The human temptation that we see powerfully in our media is to shout ever louder in the (forlorn) hope that our opponent will eventually see that we are right, and change their mind.

For Christians, Wells suggests another route. He points out St Paul's powerful words in Philippians 3:20 'Our citizenship is in heaven'. What I find most helpful about this is the radical reminder that the most important thing is not about where we are coming from, or what group we'd like to align ourselves with, but rather where we are going! The chances are we will NEVER reconcile some of our passionately-held differences of opinion. But instead of constantly reminding ourselves of these differences we could try concentrating instead on where we are going – heaven – where there is more than enough love for all, more than enough joy and truth, and space for ALL to flourish, and where these differences will seem a world away.

That points us to the definition of the Church: a bunch of people who come from a great variety of different places, but are all heading for the same place.

Being a Christian transforms our identity. Please God, it stops us forcefully trying to insist that I am right and you are wrong, as we shift our focus instead onto the journey we're all making to the place none of us have yet been. The challenge for us is to love *now* as if we're already there. Acknowledging our differences, but allowing ourselves to be owned not by whatever group we might feel we want to belong to here on earth, but rather owned by our holy, good, reconciling, and loving God.

#### Revd Graham talks to Malcolm and Janice Brown

Music and construction are two clear passions have been with Malcolm Brown throughout his life. In both arenas Malcolm looks back on a remarkable career stretching over decades, and a lasting legacy too. Malcolm has been a church organist for 71 years, and his recently purchased Johannus Organ has pride of place in the lounge. I'm amazed at how authentic it sounds as he demonstrates the tones created by the various stops and pedals. Malcolm's warm smile spreads ever broader as he plays: "you have to glide across the keys, not hammer them". This is a man with a laugh and a smile to match his passion for music and zest for life, and I get the sense that this has not diminished over his 86 years.

Janice and Malcolm are relatively new faces at St Andrews Redruth, joining us from the local Methodist circuit not so long ago. Malcolm had been the organist at RMC for 52 years, and although Janice was there too for a while, she had been part of Forest and latterly Burhos Methodist Churches both till their closure. In fact, in joining St Andrews Redruth, for the first time in a very long time, Janice and Malcolm attend church together – a new situation which they both enjoy and intend to make the most of!

Malcolm trained as a Building Manager at E. Thomas and Co. Ltd Camborne Technical College. During National Service in the Royal Engineers, he was posted to CRE Nottingham as a Military Quantity Surveyor. He met Janice through joining a youth choir and his appointment as organist at Gedling Road Methodist Church. They married in August 1955 and moved back to Cornwall.

They settled in Four Lanes and Malcolm set to work. He was in charge of the construction of a number of schools for Cornwall County Council and was then project manager of the New County Hall at Truro. As a director of E Thomas and Co he was responsible for the redevelopment of the Aerodrome Buildings at Culdrose and, at the same time, accommodation buildings at HMS Drake in Plymouth for the Royal Navy. Each project was valued at £1.3million in 1969 to name a few contracts!

In 1963 Malcolm was appointed Organist and Choirmaster at Redruth Methodist Church and remained there for 52 years. He was a trustee, subsequently member of the church council, chairman of the property committee for 25 years, leader of the junior choir for 20 years with a maximum membership of 88 children ranging from 8 to 18 years. Malcolm was made a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Builders in 1980 following qualification as a Licentiate in 1958 and Associate in 1963. He had his own Limited Company with a Partner from 1985 till retirement in 1997 at the age of 67 years.

I'm urged to make sure I include Janice in their story, and theirs is very clearly a shared love of music, indeed, they are very much the double-act in so many areas of life! Janice, originally from Nottingham, is a very keen and accomplished singer, initially as a soprano and now latterly as contralto. As a soloist Janice performed in many oratorios, including the Messiah. For 23 years Malcolm and Janice travelled to Lanivet every Tuesday for practice with Celtic Chorale, a Methodist choir with members selected from all over Cornwall. Malcolm and Janice were also founder members of another choir, Cornwall Symphony Chorus, which has been going 10 years and continues today, headed up by well-known local musician Alistair Taylor.

Photographs of their children adorn the walls of Malcolm and Janice's home, alongside pictures of grandchildren in cap and gown and now great-grandchildren too. Malcolm beams, clearly taking as much pride in *their* achievements as his own, if not more.

This will be a bring-and-share supper, inviting all those attending to bring a small savoury item; desserts and drinks will be supplied, and we thank members of the Methodist Church for their hospitality in offering their church for this event, to which *everyone is very welcome*. In mid-September, as I write, we are planning a Creationtide renewal of our commitment to the values and activities of Green Church Kernow. In this season, both of the church year and the natural round, we are reflecting on the blessings, and responsibilities, we inherit as human

beings in a world of such bounty and beauty. We are conscious, of course, of how much we all need to do to serve and conserve our environment, and although we have found our Green Church 'pathway' useful as a guide, now we are entering into a new phase.

Initially we 'crossed off' each new target until we reached our Gold award, learning along the way how each and all of us could help our world. Now though we see



being environmentally aware as part of our church 'DNA', considering our impact in all we do. A small but pleasurable feature of church life is the appearance of surplus home-grown vegetables that appear each week. These are laid at the base of the font for others to share. It's a lovely, gentle way of celebrating our harvests together and avoiding waste.

One coming 'green' event is our contribution to the National Fun Palace scheme which opens up important buildings for community creative fun exploring art and



science. There are five different buildings taking part in Redruth from the Buttermarket to Krowji and each has a different theme. Our own Fun Palace is 'The Lean, Green Recycling Machine' offering a chance for people of all ages, including children, to be creative with art, craft, and science, using recycled materials. So do drop in on Saturday 5th October between 10 am and 12 noon and see what you and your family can create out of the things we throw away!

When weather permits, some of us will be busy in our re-wilded garden area, leaving many plants to serve as vital cover for small creatures over the winter, but ensuring we have replenished our plant stocks and tended our new trees in hope of blossom and fruits next year. Perhaps at our Creationtide service we will have agreed some new plans for extending and diversifying our green space?

Finally, a 'must' for us all, rain or shine, is the St Andrew's Randoms' 'Come to the Cabaret' on the evening of Saturday 26h October starting at 7.30pm: an evening of songs from the musicals, favourite tunes, sketches, and stories. 

### Friday 01 November - 'The Old Wives Tale' by Arnold Bennett

It covers a period of about 70 years from roughly 1840 to 1905, and is set in <a href="Burslem">Burslem</a> and Paris. It is generally regarded as one of Bennett's finest works.

#### **SUMMER HOLIDAY PROJECT 2019—DSBeenies**

The Summer Holiday Project (SHP) within the Benefice of Redruth began in 2006 under the leadership of the youth project known as SEARCHLIGHT (Stephen/Euny/Andrew/Redruth/CHristchurch/Lanner/In God's Hands Together). The aim of the project was to provide activities through the six week school holiday and to show children and young people the love and care which God shows to us all.

After SEARCHLIGHT ended in 2012, the SHP came under the leadership of the newly formed DSBeenies, the youth division of an adult entertainment group, Don't Stop Believing. The DSBeenies have grown in strength and although not formally part of the church, meet on a <u>Saturday afternoon</u> at Christchurch, Lanner. The DSBeenies take as their strap-line FOLLOW-ING OUR DREAMS SO THAT OTHERS MAY REACH FOR THE STARS.

With that strap line in mind, the group raises funds for others through concerts, local activities, performances and donations. Since 2012 the young people have raised in excess of £15,000.00 for a wide range of charities and community groups. Their own funding comes from weekly subs, small grants and the generosity and kindness of others. They are especially grateful to the REDRUTH CHARITY TRUST who have supported the group year by year

This year the SHP worked with 40 children and young people. There were six outings, a theatre week which performed an original piece called "Once upon a musical" which raised £500.00 for good causes, and an away week to St Ives for 22 young people. During this week, the young people paid £30.00 to have 30 fruit trees planted around the world.

The young people are now going into rehearsal for their fourth pantomime, "Aladdin" which will be performed in Porthleven at the end of December.

### A Descent to Local Mines

Most indigenous Cornish families can speak of ancestors who were involved in mining throughout the world. This writer is told of having a paternal great grandfather and great uncle, miner small holders, who made the long journey to Michigan in the Victorian period, returning for a while to 'get the dust out of their lungs'. Similarly a great great maternal uncle who had left Pednandrea Mine in the 1850's, made the same journey to Michigan and became the underground production mine captain of the huge Calumet Hecla Mine, the largest in the State. The history of Cornish mining has always provided a source of study, both in Cornwall and overseas, for this writer - it is obviously in the genes! As boys, deserted engine-houses became castle fortresses in our play; we threw rocks down deep shafts listening to their noisy progress from level to level, and lit gorse fires in the tall chimneys to the shouts of 'The mines are working again!'

And so it was that in later life that I eagerly accepted the invitation to assist in judging an underground competition as South Crofty the First Aid Teams of Ireland, South Crofty, Wheal Jane and Geevor as a regular judge and competitor in the Redruth St John Ambulance competition team. A miner friend had taken me on an underground tour of South Crofty some time previously so that it was possible to see the dangerous working conditions, once not safeguarded, which existed in the past—sudden large drops to a lower mine level, the once choking fumes of blasting and thick abrasive dust particles from drilling, regular rock falls etc.

It was later that any member of the professional Cornwall Ambulance Service were invited to join, in a group to tour the depths of the other mines in Cornwall to make themselves familiar with the surroundings, in the event of being called to administer paramedic advanced skills to support any mine First Aid Team.

One of these was to Wheal Jane Mine near St Day, a visit which this writer recorded in his daily journal:-

'June 19th 1993 Went to Wheal Jane at 8.30am a really modern mine, so different to the other Cornish mines. Changed into boots, overalls, helmet with light and with a group of 16 went underground in the fast moving skip to the 700ft level. A wet mine, with its very wide and high levels, muddy and water-filled. We watched a pair of miners drilling at the end of the level and saw the vast drilling machine, costing £100,000, and the huge 'garage' with its inspection pit. We walked in the darkness along a rapidly declining route, the atmosphere becoming progressively hotter and more oppressive, as at South Crofty, even more so when huge machines with vast tyres passed, belching fumes like some great prehistoric monster—what would the miners of the past think!

Two miners sat at the end of the level, complaining of the great heat one eventually having to leave and go to grass (mine surface). Then down 40ft of narrow ladder to the 1100ft level, washing our hands in the warm water of a stream with iron oxide.

Passed the great pumping station here, one of several; the cost of pumping exceeds the labour bill each week—if it was a dry mine it would be exceedingly rich. We had walked underground as far as the old Nangiles Mine workings.

Coming up in the skip, which holds 40, I saw the fastly receding shaft through a gap in the floor. A shower in the 'dry', and then home to donate some blood before going to work at 11pm!'

It was shortly after that this writer, as a paramedic, visited in the engine house at South Crofty with a colleague and the mine captain on three occasions, for casualties to be brought to the surface and there did his first infusion for blood loss.

Have you ever hugged a tree, communed with nature? Others do, so what's in it for me? I chose a nice tree on the Helford River, a tall straight tree, not a gnarled twisted one, although there were plenty of them around! So I hugged it and it didn't respond, just stood straight and tall and somewhat distant! No one came along, luckily, and Dave looked as if I didn't belong to him! I probably won't repeat this but I've done it, got the proverbial T-shirt! However, on reflection I think I will save my hugs for Dave!!

So, I've hugged a tree, and I've also talked to the animals! Now, I am not an animal person so I only speak to them in extreme circumstances! We have been chased by dogs when we have been in their territory and while my heart is thumping and I am emitting a strong whiff of fear I try my Mrs. Nice Guy tactics...."Good dog; go home". I do this in my gentlest and friendliest voice so as not to aggravate the dog further. None of this works but it takes my mind off the panic bubbling up inside while we battle on through this terror zone and the barking retreats into the distance! Our daughter once gave us some dog biscuits to carry with us but the very time we were approached by a fearsome dog, the biscuits were in my rucksack so no use at all!

Sheep and I speak the same language, the odd "BAA" as we go through their field and we are both happy. Sheep, I love. Sheep are non-confrontational. I like them particularly when they are wearing their curly fleeces. They do look uncomfortable and embarrassed when they have just been shorn, almost as if they have been caught before they have had time to get dressed! But I wouldn't say "Moo" to a cow or "Boo" to a goose unless there was a gate between us!!

We have been chased by cows and horses in our time but these days we don't do that kind of wild walking so it's no problem. We know you have to steer clear of their back legs, but I am never sure how to deal with the front end!

So, apart from sheep, tree hugging seems the least hazardous! They don't bite and they don't kick but if you are caught hugging one you could lose your street cred!!
