
Rector's Notes - APRIL 2020


More change on the way!

A musician, an artist and a writer walk into a church one day...

Nope, not the start of a joke, this is Thursdays at St Euny Open Café. Every Thursday the church opens its doors for all the community to come and be together. And for the next few months, the St Euny Ukes and the crafts group have been joined by *Kruthyl*, a local community arts project. Spearheaded by Ruth Purdy, *Kruthyl* is Cornish for "making" and this project is all about making creative communities. As Ruth puts it, "creativity helps people live well, keeping body and mind connected." The project aims to give different generations opportunities to engage in creative activities together, sharing hopes and aspirations. Working with artists, writers and musicians, the café is a hub for making art, artefacts and song for and about our communities. Bringing different communities of Redruth under one roof, breaking down divisions in society and helping foster a sense of community and shared identity.

Working alongside Ruth is Kelly Stevens, a writer from Falmouth. Kelly found joy in writing after the tragic loss of a child and has exuded natural enthusiasm to help draw the creativity out of others. She started an initiative called the Write Café, initially as a 4-week well-being course which was extended by popular request and working alongside social prescribing. For some vulnerable folk in isolation it became their only social contact with others. The positive input provided a toolbox of social skills.

So how does art help, I want to know? What is its potential in all this? "Art really can change the world", insists Ruth, as she and Kelly share their personal and inspirational stories of how their own lives have been impacted by art, and examples of how people they have worked with over the years have discovered new gifts, found a new lease of life and grown in appreciation of their own selfworth. As Ruth explains, to make art you have to think positively, "you decide an action and you do it, it forces commitment. You choose to make a mark on a piece of paper, you choose a word, you create – it is a positive process."

Together with musician Nicola Edwards, the team have been leading these songwriting, poetry and painting sessions. So far each person has been encouraged to

writing, poetry and painting sessions. So far each person has been encouraged to paint an animal to somehow represent them, and then to explore positive attributes of that creature in words – the orangutan on the cover of this month's Five Alive is from your curate!

Kruthyl continues on Thursdays at St Euny 1:30-3:30pm. All are welcome to stop by and have a go even if they have not yet been before – or just come for a bit of cake and a chat.

A strange month this. The world is feeling a bit of a worrying place for many of us. The daily news is full of confusing messages - should we be stocking up on things and confining ourselves to our homes or continuing business as usual? Should we greet with an anxious smile? An elbow or foot tap? Or, and you might not want to read this if you are squeamish, hug, kiss or even high five? The one overriding message is WASH YOUR HANDS, but even that has the mixed message of whether it is for 20 seconds (Happy Birthday twice), 30 seconds (If You're Happy and You Know It Wash Your Hands) or even one minute (a verse and chorus of Shine Jesus Shine) (Cue Mum and I singing this in the kitchen, pretending to wash our hands to check it lasted for a minute!!) Whatever advice you choose to take, one thing is clear and that is that, as Christians, we should be doing all we can to support each other and our wider community.

I recently read about a taxi driver who after picking up a regular customer of his from her weekly shop, found her very distraught because she couldn't buy what she needed due to others' panic buying. After dropping her home he went around the shops until he found those things and then took them to her. In another article I read, it talked about a neighbour of someone who had got stuck in Wuhan when the quarantine broke out. They fed and gave water to their neighbour's dog, via a fishing line, between their balconies until the dog could be rescued and taken into care. People in quarantined Italy are singing and playing music from balconies to keep each other's spirits up, whilst teenagers online are teaching each other new dance moves and finding ways to get out of their online schooling!!

There are many ways that we can be God's hands, feet and eyes in these difficult times. Noticing someone isn't there when they are a regular attendee, phoning or messaging someone unwell or in quarantine, delivering shopping to those who cannot, or are fearful, to go out, and even donating tins, dried foods, and toiletries to the already stretched food banks. Just acknowledging someone with a smile, wave or kind word can make a big difference. Here at St Andrew's, Tiddlers is to be suspended for a few weeks but we will all keep in touch via facebook, food bank and craft group are still currently running, and services are continuing as scheduled. Whatever the next few weeks have in store let us remember to be the ear that listens, the eyes that see, the voices that sing and the hearts that love.

St. Andrew's Pencoys with Four Lanes Methodist Church 'FLAPJACK'

Working, praying and worshipping together as 'One in Christ'
We invite you to our joint events and services and to visit St. Andrew's Church,
open daily from 10 am to 5 pm

On 1st March, Jane Le Page, as Reader in Training, joined us at our LAMP *First Sunday Evening Event* at the United Methodist Church, Four Lanes and led an inspiring devotional meditation on the beauty of Creation. Our thanks go to everyone who came to this event, at which a retiring collection was taken to support the work of Jane (as Akela) and her Wolf Cub pack in Stithians, to raise funds for the Koalas' Eucalyptus Tree Appeal in Australia and the Koala Hospital. They are planting new eucalyptus trees, whose leaves form the natural diet of Koalas, many of which have died or starved in the recent fires raging in Australia. The next *First Sunday Evening Event* will be held on 5th April (Palm Sunday), at St. Andrew's Pencoys, at 6pm, when there will be an assessment of the past eight years of First Sunday Evening Events, started in 2012.

This year our *Palm Sunday* service will start with the Blessing of Palms at St. Andrew's Pencoys at 10.30am, followed by a procession (with pony/donkey or any other willing animal Fr. Peter may have been able to procure) to the Methodist Church for Holy Communion at 11 am, then 'Lighthouse' at 3pm for children and young people, whose activity will be shared at our *Easter Day* Family Service of Holy Communion at 11 am at St. Andrew's.





WILLIAM GLADSTONE'S VISIT TO REDRUTH 1889 by Michael Tangye

In more recent years Redruth has been visited by members of the Royal Family, Her Majesty The Queen, Princess Ann and the late Princess Diana. Although each attracted numerous spectators they were not marked by vast crowds.

How different it was in June 1889 at a time when the Cornish environment had not been discovered by the vast numbers from beyond the Tamar. At that time mining was still in progress locally and the population of almost all Cornish folk, who enjoyed any occasion for a rest from their labours. The Camborne and Redruth Mining Division was at that time a hot-bed of liberalism, The Party led by the three times Prime Minister William Gladstone MP (1809-98), whose policies appealed to the Cornish.

He had left his base at Falmouth after a telegraph had been sent telling the expected time of his arrival, followed by raising a Union Jack on the Redruth town clock.

At Lanner Mr and Mrs Gladstone, travelling in an open coach, passed through an open arch of Evergreen spanning the road and surmounted by a Union Jack. The welcome continued with bunting and flags at South Downs, whilst at Redruth slogans and arches dominated the scene.

Redruth was at that time a little different than at the present; at Clinton Road the former Art and Mining School and the then smaller St Andrew's Church, had stood for only a few years. Opposite the latter was the open site of the Passmore Edwards Library which was to follow in 1895. On this a Grandstand capable of accommodating 2,000 spectators was erected and by 2pm Clinton Road was completely 'filled with a mass of beings' who had assembled, and greeted him at 5.15pm

It was estimated that from 25,000 to 30,000 people were present when the coach arrived led by a bodyguard of 300 miners under mine Official Col. Fludger—all became completely engulfed by the crowd. Bands leading the parade were hemmed in on every side, and 'the big drum passed like a cork over the head of the crowds.'

Prominent Liberal member Mrs Dungey, who was deputising to present an address to Mrs Gladstone on behalf of the White Rose Union, was unable to reach her, such was the density of the crowd, so the address had to be passed, hand to hand, to her carriage. Mr Gladstone's speech was interrupted and drowned by the shouts of those of the crowd being crushed against the carriage and others, whilst small boys were passed over heads into the enclosure of St Andrew's Church for safety.

With the welcome completed the Gladstone's carriage was driven past the railway station, down Fore Street, Green Lane and Plain-an-Gwarry. At Falmouth Road and Penryn Street, numerous jersey-cars, waggonettes and vehicles of every description had been parked after bringing folk from neighbouring areas. The occasion had brought a memorable occasion, to be told to children and grandchildren of the future—but unfortunately somewhat marred by the action of pick-pockets who were attracted by the vast crowd.

However, I was pressed into stroking a lion cub, much against my better judgement! They said I'd regret it if I didn't!! I don't know about that!






