Rector's Notes - NOVEMBER 2019

Leading Your Church into Growth (LYCiG)



At this season of the year we typically do more remembering than usual – first at All Souls, and then at Remembrance Sunday. Of course remembering is a right and proper thing to do – it's at the centre of our worship at the altar too, after all.

But I was keen in this short piece to say something about the conference Graham and I attended recently. It was called <u>Leading Your Church into Growth</u> and most of those attending came from traditional sorts of churches. Not surprisingly the conference was for people keen to see their churches grow. In Redruth, we are very blessed by some good things happening in our churches, and some new people joining us, but I'd love to see much more of this, which is why Graham and I were there.

It was good to be reminded that growth is a natural thing! Healthy things grow, and healthy churches are no exception. Jesus tells loads of parables about growing things: mustard seeds, sowers, fig trees, vineyards, and while it's God who gives the growth, we the gardeners can have a big impact too. Growth is about growing spiritually deeper too of course. But it is definitely about numbers of people as well.

One of the things that struck me was the 4 Ps for church growth. First of all *Prayer*, which underpins all that we do. Second is *Presence* – in our benefice we're quite good at *Presence* events - typically community-type events which anyone would be happy to be at (like tea and chat, or a quiz, or a toddler group, or Open Café etc). The third P is for *Proclamation* which is being bit bolder about WHY we're here – that God is interested in us, and pointing out that church is for everyone, and would you like to come along? And the final P is for Persuasion – giving newcomers the chance to ask questions as part of a faith discovery journey.

I'd love it if all of us could be involved in this initiative somehow, especially in prayer, but also in various practical ways. Our intention is to offer a short series of meetings early in 2020 for all church members interested to find out how this might work. Please do join in when the time comes, and pray in the meantime!

A prayer for growth: God of Mission, who alone brings growth to your church;

send your Holy Spirit to give vision to our planning, wisdom to our actions, and power to our witness.

Help our churches to grow in numbers,

in spiritual commitment to you,

and in service to our local community; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Revd Graham talks to Mary Anson

I met Mary Anson for an interview at Crossroads Care Home before the training session for the new defibrillators which are set up at St Euny and at St Andrew's Redruth...

Mary explains to me the ethos of Crossroads as she shows me around the home. I had previously seen the railway themed designs at the front of the house, complete with brown GWR ticket office signs, but a tour around the rest of the house reveals that this is goes much deeper than decoration. "It's not Flambards, mind you" Mary tells me, and I half expect that to be a warning to lower my expectations as to what to find. How wrong that would be though, because as we go through the ticket office doors I enter a village which reminds me of the times past in so much detail. And that is the point of the efforts to which Mary and her team have gone to bring the Crossroads to life. We walk through a "church" area complete with Bible, pews and stained glass window, into an old fashioned "pub" which includes a dart board and old style bar, on into an area which looks like it could be the open-air of a village square, complete with lighting for daytime and evening. There's an old style shop, a barber with a lit-up red and white pole outside (and where the residents actually come for their haircuts). By the time we reach the old style TV lounge showing 1950s black and white films I am struck by the level of detail and just how different it feels to be here than the many other care homes I have visited. There is much more detail throughout the house than I can capture here, from the street names on the corridors of the residents' rooms to the brickwork designs on the walls. I want to know what the effect is, though I'm already convinced that this is no gimmick.

Mary tells me that giving the residents experiences from their childhood, brings out memories and it helps them to settle much more quickly. And Mary knows what she is talking about: many years of nursing with the NHS followed by decades' long and hard-won experience of running care homes including Tremethick and Harbour House. Mary has found herself specializing in dementia care, and is clearly passionate about doing it well; it is, as she says, a sadly growing reality. As our society lives longer, our care needs will change. But for Mary it is worth it. The real joys of this kind of care work for Mary are seeing the difference that it can make, not only to the residents themselves, but also, significantly, their families too.

ST ANDREW REDRUTH

Thank you to those who attended the two CPR training courses at Crossroads Care Home led by Mary Anson. The new defibrillator will be installed in its cabinet shortly and dedicated (see weekly sheet for the date). This will increase the network of these machines across Redruth and when called upon, be available to save a life.

Bernard, Nigel and I were honoured to be invited to serve at a special service in the Cathedral on 12 October led by Bishop Philip to celebrate the reader ministry. It was a very joyous occasion starting with a grand procession led by us around the outside of the Cathedral; a couple of pictures are included later in the magazine courtesy of Dean Roger Bush and Lois who acted as sides persons on the day. The stirring sermon was given by our own reader Jim Seth who has been involved in the training of new readers for a number of years.

We now look forward to the festive season and Christmas starting with St Andrew's Craft Fayre in the crypt on 30 November. The other date to note is 8 December for our Christmas lunch at Tehidy Park Golf Club for which we are joining with our friends at St Euny. (see details in church)

In the meantime we continue to be busy with other things. The new Garden Club meets for an hour every first Monday of the month to extend the work begun last year to create wildlife friendly features in the grounds surrounding the church. Tamsin has organised another clothes swap soiree on 16 November and on a more serious note Graham has organised an event on 21 November called Grave Talk aimed at taking the fear, mystery and apprehension out of issues concerning death and funerals which are an inevitability we must all face.#

Details of all these events and the Remembrance service and concert on 10 November are all included in this month's diary.

Finally many congratulations to Joan and David Doble and Ashton Sandry who were confirmed in the Cathedral on 19 October and joined us for their First Communion on the following Sunday followed by cake and fizz. Welcome to God's table.

Subsequently, additional funding was required for this work and for that we are indebted to Cornwall Council through their Divisional Member for Redruth South, Cllr Ian Thomas and the Community Chest Scheme. All in all, it has taken less than a year to get the funds for this defibrillator up and running.

Film Club

October's film was *Red Joan* starring Judi Dench and is based on a novel written by Jennie Rooney. October's film will be *The Imitation Game* starring Benedict Cumberbatch and Keira Knightley. In 1939, newly created British intelligence agency MI6 recruits Cambridge mathematics graduate Alan Turing to crack Nazi codes, including Enigma, which cryptanalysts had thought unbreakable. Turing's team analyse Enigma messages while he builds a machine to decipher them. Turing and team finally succeed and become heroes, but in 1952, the quiet genius encounters disgrace when authorities reveal he is gay and send him to prison.

Film Club nights are always the last Friday of each month and is part of the CFylm scheme. Doors open at 6:30pm and the film starts at 7pm. Our next film night will be on Friday, 29th November.

Galatians 5: 22-23

'But the spirit produces love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, humility, and self-control. There is no law against such things as these.'

Following last term's 'experience church', the second 'experience' took place, this time the subject was harvest.

The team reassembled, with a couple of welcome new additions, and the church was transformed. Five stations were set up representing Harvest of the garden, ocean, flock, grain and the earth.

The children were introduced to these concepts by interacting at the various stations, learning about Patience; through the planting of seeds, Peace; through the story of Jesus calming the sea, Humility; by learning that a garment is woven through the skills of many, who cannot work alone, Generosity; by the sharing of bread and the Joy of giving, by making a pot to give away.

The final experience was 'thanksgiving', where the children learned about the Jewish celebration of Sukkot. They hung fruits, bearing the words from each station in the Sukkah, which was assembled as the Jewish people do during Sukkot, to remember Moses leading his people through the desert to the promised land, which in turn reminds them of God's faithfulness.

All in all, it was a very positive time and I would like to thank all the volunteers who generously gave of their time and talents.

The wonderful harvest loaf was handcrafted and donated by Ian 'Denzil' Trevethick from Fore Street Redruth. The veg was given by Liz and Geoffrey from St Euny Churchtown and a corn sheaf was sourced by Charmaine. Margaret Davis donated a sheet which became our troubled sea, and Anthony gave the apples. A big thanks to all who donated. The harvest loaf and veg were used to form the display at the altar for the Harvest Festival service at St Euny Church on the 6th October.

During my time arranging this event I can truly say that I myself have witnessed these 'fruits of the spirit' in action and it has been a great learning time for me.
