There is a date for Bishop Hugh's translation as Bishop of Worcester. The date is **SATURDAY JANUARY 17 2026 / 2.00pm**



Bishop Hugh was consecrated in Lambeth Palace during COVID. Several watched that moment on television. He came to Cornwall as The suffragan Bishop of St Germans and next year will be translated to the Diocese of Worcester to be its diocesan bishop. **CONGRATULATIONS BISHOP HUGH.**

Bishop Hugh baptised a young person (at Christchurch) and confirmed members of the Pencoys Church. He has shown kindness, compassion and understanding in endless pastoral situations. He has brought energy and enthusiasm to countless liturgies in many Cornish churches. All this as well as being the Bishop to the Armed Forces.

Bishop Hugh will be proclaimed as the Bishop of Worcester on Saturday November 28 at 5.00pm in St Mary La Bow in Stepney, East London

The Bishop's final service in Truro is on **SUNDAY DECEMBER 7 / 4.00pm.** This is a service of Evensong where Bishop Hugh will preach. ALL are welcome to attend. The Bishop will also read from St John's Gospel at the Cathedral Festival of Lessons and Carols on December 24 at 7.00pm


GOSPEL FOR THE SECOND SUNDAY BEFORE ADVENT: Luke 21 vv5 – 19

This is a difficult reading for us all, as it points to our response to buildings, our response to the Gospel message and our reaction to the way of life we are called to follow.

Week by week around 40 young people come to the TOAST project. They need space to express themselves, they need to be shown, compassion, understanding and an interest in the world they are growing up in.

Jesus sat on the floor in a synagogue, he sat in the open air, he taught from a boat, on a mountain and in peoples houses. He was criticised and condemned for his vision of a future in which God's love would be shared with all.





THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER THIS WEEK

MONDAY NOVEMBER 17 Hugh Bishop of Lincoln 1200
Hugh of Lincoln, also known as Hugh of Avalon, was a Burgundianborn Carthusian monk and the Bishop of Lincoln, renowned for his holi
ness, compassion for the poor, and significant contributions to the Ch
urch and society.



TUESDAY NOVEMBER 18 Elizabeth of Hungary Philanthropist 1231 Elizabeth of Hungary, born on July 7, 1207, was a princess of Hungary who became a symbol of Christian kindness and charity. She was

married at a young age and became a widow at 20. After her husband's death, she used her dowry to build a hospital and worked there her self, helping the sick. Elizabeth's life was marked by her devotion to God and her commitment to serving the poor. She was canonized as a saint in 1235by the Catholic Church and is honored as a patron saint of charity.



WEDNESDAY NOVEMBER 19 Hilda Abbess of Whitby 680 Hilda was the first leader, or abbess, of the monastery at Whitby. This monastery was chosen for a major meeting called the Synod of Whitby in 664. Hilda played a big part in bringing Christianity to Anglo-Saxon England. She led several monasteries and was known for her great wisdom.



THURSDAY NOVEMBER 20 Edmund King Martyr 850 Edmund the Martyr, also known as St Edmund or Edmund of East Anglia, was a king of East Anglia who ruled from about 855 until his

death on November 20, 869. He is known for his bravery and faithfuln ess during the Viking invasions. Edmund was crowned king at a youn gage and is believed to have refused to renounce his faith, leading to his martyrdom. His story is celebrated as a symbol of courage and loyalty, and he is honored as a saint.

Children's biographies about Edmund the Martyr can be found in

various educational resources, which often include stories, illustrations, and historical context to help young readers understand his life a legacy.
