

THE GOSPEL SET FOR SUNDAY MARCH 15: John 19 25b – 27

THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER THIS WEEK


Tuesday March 17: Patrick Bishop Missionary Patron of Ireland

Patrick was born in Britain around 390 and taken to Ireland by raiders. He escaped slavery and went to Europe. Ordained as a priest he returned to Ireland as bishop. He walked around the island preaching and caring for the people. Legend tells that Patrick banished all snakes from the island.



Wednesday March 18: Cyril Bishop of Jerusalem Teacher 386

Born in about 315 Cyril became Bishop of Jerusalem when he was 34 years old. In his time, pilgrims were coming to Jerusalem as the waves of persecution were ending. He taught against the Arian heresy and initiated the observance of Holy Week and Easter.



Thursday March 19: Joseph of Nazareth

In the Gospel according to Matthew, Joseph is described as a good man. It was God's will that he should care for both Mary and Jesus and shared significant moments in Jesus' early life including the revelation to Simeon and Jesus being lost in the Temple.



Friday March 20: Cuthbert Bishop of Lindisfarne Missionary 687

Cuthbert was born in the Scottish lowlands. His early life as a shepherd gave him plenty of time for prayer and contemplation. One night he had a vision of angels, surrounded by light carrying a soul to heaven. Cuthbert decided to give his life to God. He became a missionary monk and was consecrated Bishop of Lindisfarne in 605.



Saturday March 21: Thomas Cranmer Archbishop of Canterbury Martyr 1556

Born in 1489 Thomas was recruited into the diplomatic service in 1527. Two years later he was caught up in the divorce issue between Henry VIII and Katherine of Aragon. In 1533, as Archbishop of Canterbury he pronounced in favour of the divorce and became the architect of the reformation and the author of the 1549 prayer book. He was caught up in the move to put Lady Jane Grey on the throne rather than Mary. Under Mary's reign he was tried for treason and died at the stake in 1556.


