THE GOSPEL SET FOR SUNDAY LUKE 24 vv13 - 35

The story of the Road to Emmaus with Jesus appearing to two unnamed disciples is another example of Jesus in his resurrected body not being recognised. Jesus tries to explain that the one who they thought was dead by the cross has risen, just as was prophesied.

The two disciples urge Jesus to stay with them as they enter the village of Emmaus. Jesus agreed to stay and as a meal is shared, Jesus is recognised as he breaks the bread. Jesus as with Mary Magalene and Thomas is recognised through a familiar action, a familiar word.

These resurrection appearances remind us that we too can recognise Jesus in our everyday lives – if only we take the time and trouble to look for him. Jesus is the man living outside Iceland, Jesus is the man whose marriage has broken up and he has left his home and gone into nothing. Jesus is the woman who is carrying heavy bages of shopping and pauses to rest. As we recognise Jesus in our everyday lives so we are called to respond and do what we can to help, support and forgive.

THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER THIS WEEK

TUESDAY APRIL 21 **Anselm Archbishop of Canterbury Teacher 1109**

Born in northern Italy in 1033, Anselm travelled and entered the Monastery in Le Bec. He was there for 34 years and became Abbot. As a friend of Lanfranc, Anselm became Archbishop of Canterbury and immersed himself in the life of the church and the nation. Twice he challenged the authority of the king and was exiled. Despite this he was loved by the ruling classes and the people.



THURSDAY APRIL 23 **George Martyr Patron of England**

George was probably a soldier in Palestine as the fourth century began. He lived at the start of the Diocletian wave of persecution. The legend of George slaying the dragon is probably mistaken but grew in strength during the crusades when George replaced Edward the Confessor as the patron of England and under Edward III became patron of the Order of the Garter.



FRIDAY APRIL 24 **Mellitus Bishop of London First Bishop at St Paul's 624**

Mellitus was an Abbot in Rome and was sent to England by Pope Gregory the Great to support Augustine in the conversion of England. He was consecrated Bishop and given St Paul's as his church and ultimately became Archbishop of Canterbury.



SATURDAY APRIL 25 Mark the Evangelist

John Mark was a Jew and a cousin to Barnabas. He accompanied Paul on a missionary journey. His gospel is generally accepted as the first to be written. His theology was about how following Christ was an act of both generosity and sacrifice. It is thought he based his Gospel on the teachings of Peter to whom he was a contemporary.
