### **THE GOSPEL SET FOR SUNDAY: Matthew 13 vv1 - 9 & 18 – 23**

The parable of the sower is one of the best known of all the parables that Jesus told. It's meaning is well known and focuses on how we should let our lives speak of God's love for all wherever we are.

Sometimes you'll be ignored, sometimes there'll be a little interest, sometimes you'll meet hostility but sometimes, just sometimes God's love will touch someone's life and they will go out into the world and touch the lives of others.

The important thing, is never to give up, never to get disheartened when there is little or no interest and whatever you offer is either ignored or taken for granted. Baptisms, weddings, and funerals are all moments when the church can be seen to be supportive and encouraging, thus planting the seeds of God's love. Do what you can to welcome and encourage. As Mother Teresa said:



### **THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER THIS WEEK**

#### **TUESDAY JULY 14 John Keble Priest Poet 1866**

Born in 1792, the son of a priest he showed exceptional ability and became a fellow at Oriel College Oxford. He wrote poems and although a great academic, he did not seek preferment and became a parish priest in Winchester. His preaching is thought to have inspired the Oxford Movement.



**WEDNESDAY JULY 15 Swithun Bishop of Winchester 862**

Swithun was a bishop in the 9<sup>th</sup> century but little is known of his life, although it is thought he was an advisor to king Egbert. Before his death he ordered that he should rest outside his church so that he would be trodden on by passers by and that the rain of heaven would fall on him. However, another bishop had Swithun moved inside and despite dire warnings the tradition grew that if it rained on Swithun's day it would rain for 40 days!!



**THURSDAY JULY 16 Osmund Bishop of Salisbury 1099**

Osmund came to England in the wake of William the Conqueror his mother's half-brother. He quickly became chancellor in 1072 and six years later became Bishop of Salisbury and completed the building of the cathedral.



**SATURDAY JULY 18 Elizabeth Ferard First Deaconess 1883**

Encouraged by Bishop Tait, the bishop of London to visit deaconess communities, Elizabeth founded the first community of deaconess in England. First in Kings Cross, and then in Nottingham in 1873. Its title has gradually changed from the Deaconess Order of St Andrew, to the Deacon Order of St Andrew and now simply the Community of St Andrew.
