The Platinum Jubilee celebrations are just around the corner, so this week there is a list of the events that have been planned to celebrate this significant in the life of both the nation and the world. So, with thanks to the internet, here is something about platinum

What is Platinum?

- Platinum with the atomic number 78 and an atomic mass of 195 in the periodic table is an extremely rare element found in the crust of the earth.
- The word Platinum is derived from Platina (Spanish word meaning 'little silver'), because of
 its grey-white silvery colour. With an availability of 5g/kg in the earth's crust, it is one of the
 rarest elements and is highly valuable for the same reason. Although it was discovered
 relatively later by European scientists, it has been found in Egyptian tombs dating back to
 1200 BC.

Uses of Platinum

- It is also used in laboratories for electrodes.
- Optical fibres, wires, and pacemakers also make use of platinum for better efficiency.
- Certain compounds of platinum are used in chemotherapy for treating cancer.
- Some watchmakers use platinum in their watches to make it exclusive.
- Because of its stable physical and chemical properties, platinum metal is a very useful metal. Despite its rarity, its application is quite widespread.
- Because of its high stability, platinum is used extensively as a catalyst for chemical reactions.
- The most common application of this is the Catalytic Converter in cars which converts the Carbon monoxide (CO) and other residual pollutants into Carbon dioxide (CO₂) and water vapour.
- The high malleability, ductility, and inertness of the metal make it especially suitable for making jewellery. Around half of the platinum extracted every year goes into making jewellery.

THE BIBLE PASSAGE FOR TODAY: John 10 vv22 – 30

"The Father and I are one" said Jesus as he walked round the Temple in Jerusalem on a major Jewish Festival. THURSDAY MAY 12 GREGORY DIX Priest Monk Scholar 1952

Gregory Dix was born on 4 October 1901 in Woolwich, South London. He was the son of Mary Jane Dix, a Methodist and George Henry Dix, a schoolmaster and Anglo-Catholic priest who served as the first principal of the College of St Mark and St John, Chelsea Gregory was educated at Westminster School and won a scholarship to Merton College, Oxford He was ordained as a deacon on 5 October 1924 and as a priest on 4 October 1925. He entered the Nashdom Community the following year and was sent to the Gold Coast as a novice until his health broke down in 1929.


Returning to Nashdom he and his final vows only 1940. During the Second World War he lived for a while in Beaconsfield, Buckinghamshire, and looked after the Anglo-Catholic daughter church of St Michael whilst his brother Ronald, who was the priest there, served as a military chaplain. With another monk he lived in the parsonage, kept the round of monastic offices and cared for the parish. Gregory became prior of his abbey in 1948.

The choosing by 'lot' rather than a democratic vote, was for the Apostles a method which would enable God to make the choice.
