GOSPEL FOR SUNDAY / TRINITY 8 Mark 6 vv30 – 34 / 53 – end

In this reading it is clear that Jesus was a magnet for people on the edge, people who were vulnerable and with complex needs. It is also clear that Jesus didn't cross the road to help anyone. They came to him and he did what he could to support and strengthen them.

Jesus was always available to those who came to him; the Roman Centurion, Jairus, the lepers. His parables were all about doing what you can to bring God's love into the world, and being ready to take every opportunity offered; the prodigal son, the bridesmaids, the good Samaritan.

We in our turn must be ready to do what we can when our help, support or guidance is needed. This is part of the purpose of the 'Warm Space' in the Crypt. No questions are asked of those who come through the door, there is simply a welcome, warm food and someone to listen if that need arises.





THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER DURING THE WEEK

MONDAY JULY 22 Mary Magdalen

All four Gospels give Mary Magdalene a unique place among Jesus' followers. Probably from the village of Magdala by the Sea of Galilee, she was, according to tradition healed by Jesus before following him. Among other faithful women she remained at the cross and then went on to be the first to discover the empty tomb and to see the resurrected Jesus; hence, she is the Apostle to the Apostles. Another tradition has Mary Magdalen consecrated as Bishop.



TUESDAY JULY 23 Bridget of Sweden Abbess 1373

Bridget's father was a governor in Uppland when Bridget was born in 1303. She maried at the age of 14 and had 8 children. Bridget was a mystic from a young age and when her husband died in 1343 Bridget founded a monastery for both nuns and monks. This became known as the Brigattine Order. It was influential throughout Europe and there is a church on the way to St Just dedicated to her.



THURSDAY JULY 25 James the Apostle

This James, often called 'the great' was a fisherman from Galilee, who with his brother John were amongst the first to be called to follow Jesus. He was amongst the inner group who witnessed the Transfiguration and the events in Gethsemane. But they annoyed the other disciples by asking to sit on Jesus; right and left in glory. He died under Herod Agrippa around 44 in a wave of persecution. In St Ives there is a procession to the hill top pyramid, the John Knill's Monument on this day every five years.




FRIDAY JULY 26 Anne & Joachim Parents of the BVM

In the Gospel of James, written in the second century Mary and Joachim are named as the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The account is based on the conception and birth of Samuel through Hannah.



SATURDAY JULY 27 Brooke Foss Westcott Bishop of Durham 1901

Born in 1825, Brooke was ordained and then went to teach at Harrow School. His intellect and writings led him to be appointed as Regis Professor of Divinity at Cambridge in 1870. He was instrumental in founding Westcott House which trains clergy. In 1890 he was consecrated Bishop of Durham.

PPS: The following statement is from a regular attender at the 9am Morning Prayer

I was born in London into a family that had no church connections or spiritual tradition. As a teenager I came to the Christian faith through a friend and was confirmed in the Anglican church at the age of 20. I worked as a secretary in the advertising industry for many years until I felt the need to do something more meaningful. I was invited to offer my skills as a resident volunteer with the Iona Community on the Isle of Iona, after which I trained as a Social Worker in Edinburgh.

I worked in a large male prison as well as high security psychiatric hospitals and in the local community. At the same time I undertook trainings in transpersonal psychotherapy and faith accompaniment. In the 1990's I was inspired by a Roman Catholic nun to open my mind to other faiths, teachings and practices. With the gift of hindsight, I now see that led to my life during the last 20 years as a 'pilgrim visiting, working & living in a number of spiritual communities.

Most recently I was in Mexico where I was invited to be ordained as a permanent Deacon in the Western Diocese of the Anglican church there. Recently I returned to the UK as I believe the gifts and experience I have been given can be more fully utilised here. I feel a calling to be alongside those on the edge of society, those who would not normally come to church. I also feel inspired to offer retreats, contemplative practices and reflective yoga in order to dive deeply into the true nature of our Being with those who share that desire.

Currently I am seeking accommodation for a couple of months until it becomes clear where I am to settle. I have made links with a few people in Redruth and Truro online and would value the opportunity to begin my time in Cornwall in that area but am open to where the Spirit would have me live, serve and be.
