THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER DURING THE WEEK

THURSDAY JULY 11 Benedict of Nursia Abbot of Monte Cassino 550

Born in Nursia in central Iraly around 480 Benedict studied in Rome. However, he was so disturbed by the corruption he saw that he left the world and became a hermit in Subiaco. He attracted others and small monasteries were founded. In 525 an attempt was made on his life and swith a band of loyal monks he went to Monte Casino. Here we wrote his 'Rule for Life' which became the foundation of western monasticism.
