
Dear Readers,

GOSPEL FOR SUNDAY / TRINITY 9 John 6 vv1 - 21

Theologians have argued for centuries about the feeding of the 5,000. How did it happen? Was it just family groups sharing their lunch? Was it a picture, an image of the Sacrament of Holy Communion which always has enough for everyone. We can argue about and discuss the meaning, but in the end it is your faith that will bring you the answer.

However, today's Gospel tells us that when the moment was over, the crowd was acclaiming Jesus as their King. Jesus immediately withdraws to a lonely place. It was not his purpose to become an earthly King. His purpose was to feed the people with God's love so that they could stand and not be afraid; so that they could take that same love out into the world for others to share.

It is easy to get carried away when you have achieved something, or said something of note. To hear the praise and to glory in it. To forget that everything we do, everything we say is to the glory or the detriment of God. To forget that we are God's instrument on earth and an instrument is nothing until it is lifted.



THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER DURING THE WEEK MONDAY JULY 29 Mary Martha & Lazarus Friends of Jesus

The Gospels describe how the sisters Mary, Martha and their brother Lazarus offered hospitality to Jesus at their home in Bethany, just outside Jerusalem. After Lazarus died, Jesus moved by the grief of the sisters, raised their brother from the dead.



TUESDAY JULY 30 William Wilberforce Social Reformer 1833

William was born in Hull in 1759. He was a convert to the Evangelical wing of the church and chose parliament over ordination. He was a founded member of 'The Bible Society' and the Evangelical group known as 'The Clapham Sect'. He is best known for his opposition to slavery. Through his campaigning, slavery was made illegal in 1807 throughout the British Empire, and in 1833 the practice was finally abolished.



WEDNESDAY JULY 31 Ignatius of Loyola Founder 1556

Born in 1491 Ignatius was wounded in the Battle of Pamplona in 1521. Whilst recovering he read 'The Life of Christ', was converted and gathered six other believers with him. They took vows and in 1540 the Pope approved the new Order: *The Jesuits*.

PPS: The following statement is from a regular attender at the 9am Morning Prayer

I was born in London into a family that had no church connections or spiritual tradition. As a teenager I came to the Christian faith through a friend and was confirmed in the Anglican church at the age of 20. I worked as a secretary in the advertising industry for many years until I felt the need to do something more meaningful. I was invited to offer my skills as a resident volunteer with the Iona Community on the Isle of Iona, after which I trained as a Social Worker in Edinburgh.

I worked in a large male prison as well as high security psychiatric hospitals and in the local community. At the same time I undertook trainings in transpersonal psychotherapy and faith accompaniment. In the 1990's I was inspired by a Roman Catholic nun to open my mind to other faiths, teachings and practices. With the gift of hindsight, I now see that led to my life during the last 20 years as a 'pilgrim visiting, working & living in a number of spiritual communities.

Most recently I was in Mexico where I was invited to be ordained as a permanent Deacon in the Western Diocese of the Anglican church there.Recently I returned to the UK as I believe the gifts and experience I have been given can be more fully utilised here. I feel a calling to be alongside those on the edge of society, those who would not normally come to church. I also feel inspired to offer retreats, contemplative practices and reflective yoga in order to dive deeply into the true nature of our Being with those who share that desire. Currently I am seeking accommodation for a couple of months until it becomes clear where I am to settle. I have made links with a few people in Redruth and Truro online and would value the opportunity to begin my time in Cornwall in that area but am open to where the Spirit would have me live, serve and be.
