GOSPEL FOR SUNDAY: John 10 vv11 - 18

The four readings for this Sunday combine to herald "Good Shepherd" Sunday. This is the Sunday when the church teaches that through Jesus the world can find hope, healing and help. Perhaps each one of us has received those same qualities through the actions of others. Because it is through the people of the world that God's love is made known.

The Gospel reading records that it is through Jesus, the chief shepherd, that the world can be healed. The Gospel also records that through Jesus, God will not tire of bringing love into the world. We are God's instruments in the world, instruments of God's love and remember always: **an instrument is nothing until it is lifted.** May each one of us be part of the orchestra of God's love made visible in the world.





THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER DURING THE WEEK

TUESDAY APRIL 23 George Patron of England Martyr 304

George was probably a soldier living in Palestine at the start of the fourth century. He was martyred during the persecution era of Diocletian. The legend of 'George and the dragon' was probably due to iconography confusing George with Michael, both are shown wearing armour, and it is Michael who fights the dragon!! George replaced Edward the Confessor as the patron of England following the crusades when returning soldiers told of his bravery with the dragon!! King EdwardIII made George the patron of The Order of the Garter.



WEDNESDAY APRIL 24 Mellitus Bishop of London First Bishop of St Paul's 624 Mellitus was sent by Pope Gregory to support Augustine who had been sent to convert England. Mellitus was consecrated bishop by Augustine as Bishop of the East Saxons with his see in London and his cathedral dedicated to St Paul. He was translated to Canterbury in 619 having overcome various setbacks and a period of exile in France.

THURSDAY APRIL 25 Mark the Evangelist

John Mark was a Jew, and by tradition, a cousin to Barnabas. He went with Paul and Barnabas on the first missionary journey. He also went to Cyprus, and on to Rome. The Gospel attributed to him, believed to be the earliest of the four was probably written in Rome and was probably based on Peter's sermons as well as his own memories. He is believed to have written the Gospel to energise the faithful who were waiting for the end of the world, the second coming, the Parousia, believing it was imminent.



SATURDAY APRIL 27 Christina Rossetti Poet 1894

Christina Rossetti was born in 1830 and was linked with the Pre-Raphaelite movement of which her brother, Dante was a prominent member. Her elder sister became a religious but Christina's fame rests on her poetry. Her poetry deals with religious matters and also unrequited love. She was a 'feminist' and wrote the carol: "In the bleak mid-winter". From the poem: "Passing Away"

"Passing away, saith the world, passing away: Chances, beauty and youth sapped day by day"
