GOSPEL FOR EpIphany 1 / The Baptism of Christ / Luke 3 vv15 – 17 & 21 – 22

Jesus was baptised by John, and that links everyone who has experienced a water baptism with Jesus and his teaching through the Gospel. The promises that are taken reflect that same Gospel:

DO YOU TURN TO CHRIST: are you conscious effort and turning from the darkness and embracing the light of God's love

DO YOU REPENT OF YOUR SINS: are you aware of what separates you from God, and are you sorry and making an effort to put matters right

DO YOU RENOUNCE EVIL: are you pushing away the behaviour, words and actions that you know separate you from both God's love, and the people of the world, all of whom are precious to God

Then, there is a declaration of the Christian faith: DO YOU BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER WHO MADE THE WORLD? DO YOU BELIEVE AND TRIST IN JESUS CHRIST WHO REDEEMED THE WORLD? DO YOU BELIEVE AND TRUST IN THE HOLY SPIRIT WHO BRINGS LIFE TO THE PEOPLE OF GOD?

Perhaps you remember your own baptism, perhaps you are a Godparent, perhaps you have been a guest. As you recall the promises may God bless you and help you to be faithful to the pathway of light which Jesus proclaimed and was affirmed through his own baptism.



THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER DURING THE WEEK


MONDAY JANUARY 13 Hilary Bishop of Poitiers Teacher 367

Born of Pagan parents in Poitiers around 315, Hilary received an excellent education and was baptised at the age of 30. He was consecrated in 350 and was caught up in the Arian heresy which he refuted. He was known for his kindness and friendship.



FRIDAY JANUARY 17 Antony of Egypt Hermit Abbot 356

Born around 251, Antony was from a rich family. However, he heard the Gospel message sold everything he had, gave the money to the poor and went to live in the desert. Here he gained spiritual wisdom and many came to seek his guidance. He died aged 105 and had requested that he be buried, secretly in the desert. He thus became known as the patron saint of lost causes and objects.
