GOSPEL FOR Epiphany 3 / Luke 4 vv14 - 21


In this passage Jesus make it clear that he has come to the vulnerable, to upset the established system and to create a society where all are of worth. It is a powerful passage and one that makes uncomfortable reading for those in positions of authority.

The passage also reminds us that the Christian Gospel is a difficult pathway to follow and that as well as praying and working for peace and justice, each one of us must struggle to make those qualities a reality in our own lives.



THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER DURING THE WEEK

TUESDAY JANUARY 28 Thomas Aquinas Priest Philosopher 1274 Born in Italy, Thomas is hailed as the greatest teacher and thinker of the medieval church. Educated by the Benedictines and later at a university in Naples he entered the Dominican Order of Preachers. He was gentle and kind and had the nickname ' the angelic doctor'.




THURSDAY JANUARY 30 Charles King & Martyr 1649

Born in 1600 Charles was the second son of James 1. His elder brother died and at the age of 12 Charles became the heir. He ascended the throne in 1625 and was at once in conflict with Parliament. There was a Puritan force in the land and Charles held High Church views. Civil War resulted and Charles was arrested and executed. He is seen as a martyr for his suffering and death were linked to his faith.



FRIDAY JANUARY 31 John Bosco Priest Founder 1888 John was born in 1815 to a peasant family and spent most of his life near Turin, Italy. His calling was to help the young and he set up educational projects based on compassion and care. His insistence on vocational training was copied by others. To extend the work he founded the Salesian Order which grew rapidly throughout Europe.



SATURDAY FEBRUARY 1 Brigid Abbess of Kildare 525

Brigid, also known as Bride was born towards the end of the 5th century five miles from Kildare. She became a nun and later the abbess of her community. Baptised by St Patrick, she, like other Celtic saints had an affinity with nature. Brigid, together with Patrick are credited with founding the church in Ireland.
