Evensong is a church service traditionally held near sunset focused on singing psalms and other biblical canticles. It is loosely based on the canonical hours of vespers and compline. Old English speakers translated the Latin word *vesperas* as *æfensang*, which became 'evensong' in modern English. Typically used in reference to the Anglican daily office's evening liturgy, it can also refer to the pre-Reformation form of vespers or services of evening prayer from other denominations, particularly within the Anglican Use of the Catholic Church.

GOSPEL FOR THE 3rd SUNDAY BEFORE LENT: Luke 6 vv17 – 26

This version of the Sermon on the Mount challenges each one of us to look at our own lives and what swe are doing to make the world a better place. A world which God created, populated with people who are what God wanted them to be.

THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER DURING THE WEEK

MON. FEBRUARY 17: Janani Luwum Archbishop of Uganda Martyr 1977 Born in Uganda in 1922 he worked as a goatherd. However, his abilities were noticed and he trained as a teacher. He was converted to Christianity and ordained in 193, consecrated a bishop in 1969 and translated to Archbishop of Uganda in 1974. Idi Amin had come to power in 1971 and quickly clashed with the Archbishop. This led to his death. At his funeral, there was no body and the cry went up: why do you look for the living among the dead?"
