GOSPEL FOR THE FOURTH SUNDAY BEFORE LENT: John 12 vv1 – 8

This passage was the one chosen by the Archdeacon of Bodmin at the intergenerational workshop held recently in the united parish. We were asked which of the characters we most identified with and why? Perhaps we identify with them all. Wanting to give the best we can to Jesus through the mission of the church, or being jealous of someone else's actions which bring faith to others. Whatever emotions the passage brings to the surface for you, we are all reminded that Jesus is preparing for his death and on to the glory of his resurrection.



THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER DURING THE WEEK

WEDNESDAY APRIL 9 Dietrich Bonhoeffer Pastor Martyr 1945

Born in 1906, Dietrich was ordained into the Lutheran Church and moved into an academic career in both Spain and the USA. He returned to Berlin in 1931 and broke from the Lutherans in 1934, becoming a leader in the anti Nazi movement known as The Continuing Church. In 1939 he left a lecture tour in the USA and returned to Germany. His opposition to Hitler led to his arrest in 1943. He died, murdered, at Flossenbergl concentration camp in 1945.



THURSDAY APRIL 10 William Law Priest Writer 1761

William Law was a Church of England priest who lost his position at Emmanuel College, Cambridge, when his conscience would not allow him to take the required oath of allegiance to the first Hanoverian monarch, King George I.

Previously, William Law had given his allegiance to the House of Stuart and is sometimes considered a second-generation non-juror. Thereafter, Law continued as a simple priest (curate), and when that too became impossible without the required oath, Law taught privately and wrote extensively.



FRIDAY APRIL 11 George Selwyn First Bishop of New Zealand 1878

Born in 1809 and educated at Cambridge he became a curate in Windsor after ordination. In 1841 he was consecrated as the first bishop of New Zealand and stayed there for 27 years. He stood for Maori rights against colonists and his organisation of the church influenced the whole Anglican Communion and he inaugurated the Lambeth Conference of Bishops. In 1868 he returned to England to become the Bishop of Lichfield.
