GOSPEL FOR PENTECOST: John 16 vv12 - 15

This passage includes references to the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. There are many theological and much simpler ways to explain the mystery of the Trinity eg. *a three point plug, where all the wires must be in place for the power to flow* and*ice to water to steam to water to ice.* But in the Trinity will always remain a mystery with perhaps *God the Creator, Jesus the redeemer and the Spirit the sustainer* combining us to draw close to God's love for the world and to follow God's pathway.

But, in the end the words of Jesus points the way:

"there is much that I could say to you, but you could not bear it now" Through the miracles and parables, Jesus makes God's love clear. It is a love that knows no barriers, a love which is equal for all people, a love which shows that forgiveness, peace, light and hope is for all people. As an individual grows in faith, they will come to understand the three elements of the Trinity and will understand from their own life experiences God's love for them and for the world.




THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER THIS WEEK

MONDAY JUNE 16: Richard Bishop of Chichester 1253

Richard was born in 1197 and worked to restore his family fortunes which were in decline. After studies in Europe he worked as an ecclesiastical lawyer. Returning to England he became Chancellor to the Archbishop of Canterbury. Eventually, Richard was consecrated as Bishop of Chichester and was much loved as he walked round his diocese and being available to all who needed him. He also insisted that the blessed sacraments should be given without payment.




TUESDAY JUNE 17: Samuel & Henrietta Barnett Reformers 1913 & 1936 Born in 1844 Samuel was ordained and sent to be the Vicar of St Jude's in Whitechapel. He became known for his work to improve the conditions of east London. He was supported in this by his wife Henrietta who was born in Clapham in 1851. Henrietta went on to found Hampstead Garden Suburb where all social classes lived together. At Aldagte East, the local primary school is named Canon Barnett School with its playground on the roof!!





WED. JUNE 18: Bernard Mizeki Apostle of the MaShona Martyr 1896 Bernard who was born in 1861 in Portuguese East Africa was converted by the Cowley Fathers. He worked a mongst the MaShona community in what is now Zimbabwe. He died in a tribal uprising and is remembered throughout Central Africa where the site of his martyrdom has become a place of pilgrimage.



THURSDAY JUNE 19: Corpus Christi / A day to give thanks for HC.

The festival goes back centuries and was the day when the faithful gave thanks for the gift of Holy Communion. Although originally a festival within the Roman Catholic Church its appeal is now much wider and gives the faithful an opportunity to remember The Last Supper where the sacrament originated.
