GOSPEL FOR PENTECOST: Luke 8 vv26 - 39

This is a difficult reading and has links with both the historic situation and events of today. The story takes place immediately after Jesus had calmed the storm, thus showing his power over the elements, especially over the waves, beneath which current theology said was the haunt of the evil one. Jesus talks to the demon and discovers that its name is 'legion'. The people watching the miracle unfold knew all about legions, Roman legions were part of their life.

After the demons had been cast out, and Jesus had done this before, they enter the pigs who rush into the sea. The pigs drown, and the people have witnessed their destruction beneath the waves. They know they will not return and that the possessed man and their community can move on in the light.

You may feel sympathy with the pigs, BUT bad things happen. Why did the Indian airliner fall from the sky? why are there earthquakes with massive loss of life? why are there explosions, violence and oppression? Bad things happen. BUT through those bad things we learn about kindness, support, gentleness, peace and love. Through the loss of the pigs, the villagers and especially the possessed man went out and proclaimed God's love for the world. Through bad events in our lifetime, we have the opportunity to do what we can to bring God's love and light into the world.



THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER THIS WEEK

MONDAY JUNE 23: Etheldreda Abbess of Ely 678

Etheldreda (Audrey) was born in Suffolk and was the daughter of a king. Although part of two marriages, neither were valid and Etheldreda went on to found a religious house at Ely for both men and women over which she presided as Abbess. She is remembered as a woman of austerity, prayer and prophecy,



TUESDAY JUNE 24: The birth of John the Baptist

The story of John starts before his actual birth when Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth and there is a recognition between the two unborn children. John goes on to be known as 'the forerunner'; the one who prepares the way for the ministry of Jesus.



WEDNESDAY JUNE 25: Ember Day

At this time we pray especially for those to be made Deacon and those to be ordained priest at St Peter's tide. Although not from our worshipping community, we pray especially for IAN DAWES who is to be made a deacon in Truro Cathedral at 7.30pm on FRIDAY JUNE 27.

FROM THE INTERNET:

Ember Days are quarterly periods of prayer, fasting, and reflection observed in the liturgical calendar of Western Christian churches, traditionally occurring on the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday following specific feast days.

Ember Days, derived from the Latin term *quatuor tempora* meaning "four times," have been observed since at least the 5th century. They were established to give thanks for the gifts of nature, encourage moderation in their use, and assist those in need. The practice likely originated from ancient agricultural feasts and was adapted by the Christian Church to mark the changing seasons. While Ember Days were widely observed in the past, their practice has diminished, particularly after the reforms of Vatican II in the 1960s. In some traditions, they are still recognized, particularly in Anglicanism and among certain Catholic communities.

In summary, Ember Days are a rich tradition within the Christian liturgical calendar, emphasizing gratitude, reflection, and the cyclical nature of the seasons. They provide an opportunity for believers to engage in spiritual practices that honor the gifts of creation.



FRIDAY JUNE 27: Cyril Bishop of Alexandria Teacher 444

Cyril was born in Alexandria was ordained priest and succeeded his uncle as Patriarch in 412. He defended the doctrine of the Trinity, emphasising the divinity and humanity of Jesus. His opponents argued that two people existed within Jesus, one divine, the other human. Thus the title of Mary as the Theotokos (the God bearer) was denied. The situation was resolved at The Council of Ephesus in 431 which backed the theology of Cyril.



SATURDAY JUNE 28: Irenaeus Bishop of Lyons Teacher 200

Irenaeus was born around 130. He heard Polycarp preach, and Polycarp had been a disciple of the Apostle John. Irenaeus studied at Rome and in time became Bishop of Lyons in 177. He argued against the Gnostic heresy which denied the divinity of Jesus.



As we pray for Ian Dawes and the parishes in which he will serve, in the North Cornwall Cluster with the churches of: St Endellion, St Enodoc, St James the Great, St Michael's, St Minver and St Peter's in Port Isaac we remember St Stephen, first Deacon and first Martyr. Ian will wear his stole on the cross as a reminder that the first Deacons wore money bags to support the needy, and to show their heart was full of love for their people.
