Dear Readers,

Perhaps many of the regular readers missed that yesterday **SUNDAY JUNE 22** was **WINDRUSH SUNDAY.** This article may help us all to remember:

Windrush Sunday is an opportunity for all Christians in Britain and Ireland to celebrate the many contributions that those hailing from the Caribbean have made to churches on these shores. Indeed, Windrush Sunday is a celebration of the Windrush generation, the men, women and children who came to these shores from 1948 to 1972, and the way they have transformed life in Britain and Ireland in so many positive ways. Various historians and scholars have revealed how these folks have breathed new energy into the spiritual life of the Church. Windrush Sunday is also a celebration of all those who continue to make their homes on these shores, and are now mainstays of the Church.

Immigration and asylum have become major public-policy issues in both Britain and Ireland, invariably characterised by a toxicity of discourse. However, the movement of people – going from one place to another for a variety of reasons – is a common characteristic in the Bible – in both the Old and New Testament. What is more, God invariably encourages his people to be hospitable to those who are 'strangers' or 'travellers'. If that is God's attitude, what should be ours regarding asylum seekers, and those looking to start a new life on these shores?

GOSPEL FOR SAINTS PETER AND PAUL: Matthew 16 vv13 - 19

This Gospel will be read just two days after three deacons were made and one day after two priests were ordained in Truro Cathedral. The deacons will wear the crossed stole indicating their role as a servant amongst those whom they serve. The priests will untie the stole and it will remind them of the yolk that binds them to God and to their commitment to bring God's love into the lives of many.

The services will remind the new priests and deacons that they do not do this work alone but that it is a shared work with the people and communities to whom they minister.

No longer can it be said: "If Father says jump, just answer "how high"". The work of bringing God's love into the world is being shared in a way that Rebecca, our Rector is putting into place through the "Worship Leaders" course. Although it is the responsibility of us all the care for each other, the soon to be licensed 'Worship Leaders' will carry a specific responsibility toi open new doors and windows to us all through their leading of our worship.

Vicar of Clapham in 1792. John was one of the founders of the Church
Missionary Society / CMS in 1797. John was an active abolitionist. His own
son, Henry junior was born in Clapham in 1796. He too was ordained and
after several livings devoted himself to the work of CMS and to the
Evangelical wing of the church.
