GOSPEL FOR TRINITY 7: Luke 12 vv13 – 21

This week it is the parable of the rich man who increased his storage space to cope with a bumper corn harvest and the wealth he already had. One is reminded of a grandma's knowing remark: *no pockets in a shroud or you can't take it with you.*

Giving away all you have could make you dependent on the kindness and generosity of others. Jesus himself depended on others like Mary, Martha and Lazarus. So what can we do. If you give to a charity, you are like to receive other requests for help. In the days of SEARCHLIGHT the young people supported three other young people in struggling nations. That is still going at a cost of £40 / month.

But you as a parish are so generous. The First Sunday Events has raised thousands for so many. Every appeal, fund-raising event or specific collection brings in generous donations. So **THANKYOU** for all that you are able to give.

But in the end it is the action of governments that will facilitate that the children of Gaza and Sudan are fed; that the needs of people with disabilities, no home, wrongfully accused and imprisoned and so many, many other needs are resolved.

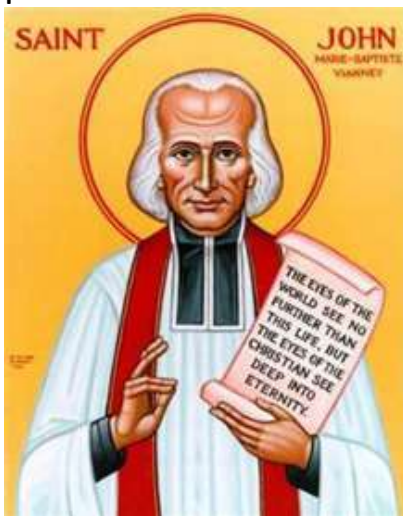

THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER THIS WEEK

MONDAY AUGUST 4: Jean-Baptiste Vianney Cure d'Ars 1859

Born near Lyons in 1786, Jean-Baptiste spend much of his childhood working on his father's farm. At the age of 20 he began studying for the priesthood and was ordained in 1815. He was appointed parish priest in 1818 to a remote village Ars-en-Dombes. His skill in preaching and spiritual guidance spread and it vis said he up too 300 penitents a day. He resisted all offers of promotion and remained in Ars until his death.



TUESDAY AUGUST 5: Oswald King of Northumbria Martyr 642

Born around 605 Oswald was thye son of Aelfrith, king of Northumbria. He left home after his father's death and went to Iona where he was influenced by St Columba. He returned to Northumbria in 634 where he defeated the

British, using a cross as his standard and praying with his soldiers the night before a decisive battle.



WEDNESDAY AUGUST 6: TRANSFIGURATION

The moment is recorded in the Gospel of Matthew, Mark and Luke and is central to Jesus mission as he is seen between Moses and the law and Elijah the prophet. Jesus is the fulfilment of both traditions and thus is seen as the Messiah, the chosen one.



FRIDAY AUGUST 8: Dominic Founder 1221

Dominic was born in 1170 and became an Augustinian. He was appointed Prior in 1201 and whilst travelling through France encountered the Cathar heresy which claimed that the world was in conflict with God. To counter this heresy, Dominic founded an Order of Preachers which carried the orthodox theology out into the world.



SATURDAY AUGUST 9: Mary Sumner Founder of the Mother's Union 1921

Born Mary Heywood in 1828 she married George Sumner, a young priest who would later become Bishop of Guildford on 1888. To help her husband and as a mother of three children Mary called a meeting of mothers and the Mothers Union was formed. Its purpose was to be a forum for discussion and an encouragement for Christian families.
