Bishop Hugh was consecrated in Lambeth Palace during COVID. Several watched that moment on television. He came to Cornwall as The suffragan Bishop of St Germans and next year will be translated to the Diocese of Worcester to be its diocesan bishop. **CONGRATULATIONS BISHOP HUGH.**

Bishop Hugh baptised a young person (at Christchurch) and confirmed members of the Pencoys Church. He has shown kindness, compassion and understanding in endless pastoral situations.

He has brought energy and enthusiasm to countless liturgies in many Cornish churches. All this as well as being the Bishop to the Armed Forces.

GOSPEL FOR TRINITY 11: LUKE 14 vv1 & vv7 – 14

It is another reading about power, and who can be the most important. But in this reading Jesus goes a step further. He tells us not to just invite our close circle, rather invite those on the edge, those who cannot return your hospitality.

Recently a youngish man, we'll call him Gareth, has been living in a tent at the side of the church. He was given, food, a blanket, the offer of cash, drinks and as much help as possible. BUT, we didn't invite him in.

'Crisis at Christmas' a charity that operates all year but does, at Christmas, invite people in, to stay, for a couple of weeks in its centres. In COVID there was a government initiative: "Everybody IN". Sadly, when the emergency was over, it became "Everybody OUT".

Perhaps, just perhaps we can look for a way to go beyond a sandwich and a drink and find way to say "welcome, come IN, stay for a while until you can find where you can be safe and cared for. Until then, we will make you welcome. This picture is of a Sikh Langar, which simply feeds people everyday



THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER THIS WEEK

MONDAY SEPTEMBER 1: Giles of Provence Hermit 710

As a hermit, Giles founded a monastery which became a stopping point for pilgrims on the way to Compostela and the Holy Land. It was also a place where the wounded, disabled and especially lepers were welcomed and cared for.



TUESDAY SEPTEMBER 2: The Martyrs of Papua New Guinea 1901 & 1942 James Chalmers and his companions were sent to Papua, New Guinea and were martyred in 1901. \$0 years later, the land was occupied by the Japanese in the second world war. In 1942 333 Church workers and priests were martyred.



WEDNESDAY SEPTEMBER 3: Gregory the Great Bishop of Rome 604
Born in 540, Gregory was the son of a Roman Senator. Following the death of his father, Gregory gave up his diplomatic career and became a monk, /In 579 he was sent to Constantinople to represent the Pope and was himself elected Pope in 590. As Pope he sent Augustine to England on a mission. His own ministry echoed his belief that he was the servant of the servants of God.



THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 4: Birinius Bishop of Dorchester 650

Born in the sixth century Birinius became a priest in Rome and felt a call to become a missionary. He was consecrated bishop and sent by the Pope to Britain to evangelise the people. Landing in Wessex he went no further. He converted King Cynigils and made the town of Dorchester his see.



SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 6: Allen Gardiner Founder 1851

Born in 1794 he joined the navy in and resigned in 1826. When his wife died in 1834, Allen dedicated himself to missionary work. He was sent to South Africa, founded the city of Durban and then in 1844 went to South America where he and other missionaries died of starvation.
