Bishop Hugh was consecrated in Lambeth Palace during COVID. Several watched that moment on television. He came to Cornwall as The suffragan Bishop of St Germans and next year will be translated to the Diocese of Worcester to be its diocesan bishop. **CONGRATULATIONS BISHOP HUGH.**

Bishop Hugh baptised a young person (at Christchurch) and confirmed members of the Pencoys Church. He has shown kindness, compassion and understanding in endless pastoral situations. He has brought energy and enthusiasm to countless liturgies in many Cornish churches. All this as well as being the Bishop to the Armed Forces.

GOSPEL FOR TRINITY 14 / The Festival of St Matthew, Apostle Matthew 9 vv9 - 13

This well known reading has Jesus called Matthew a tax collector to follow him. Matthew does so and is lead immediately into a conflict situation. Matthew gives a dinner and the guest list of people 'on the edge' is immediately criticised by the Pharisees, the church hierarchy. Jesus will have none of it and makes it quite clear that his work is amongst those who society rejects. He challenges the church leaders to go and think about that and to do the same. What should we, as a parish with someone sleeping in a tent adjacent to one of the churches do?

Early Life and Background

Saint Matthew, also known as Levi, was likely born in Galilee and worked as a tax collector in Capernaum, a profession that was despised by the Jewish community due to its association with Roman oppression. His calling by Jesus is described in the Gospels, where Jesus saw him at his tax booth and said, "Follow me," prompting Matthew to leave his lucrative job and become a disciple.

Apostolic Ministry


After becoming one of Jesus' closest followers, Matthew witnessed many of Christ's teachings and miracles. He is traditionally credited with writing the Gospel of Matthew, which is the first book of the New Testament. This Gospel emphasizes Jesus as the Messiah and is particularly aimed at a Jewish audience, highlighting the fulfillment of Old Testament prophecies.

Later Life and Death

Following the resurrection of Jesus, Matthew is believed to have preached the Gospel in Judea and later traveled to various regions, including Ethiopia, where he is said to have converted many to Christianity. The exact details of his death are unclear, with traditions suggesting he may have been martyred, though accounts vary widely regarding the manner of his death.

Feast Days and Legacy

Saint Matthew is commemorated on September 21 in the Western Christian tradition and on November 16 in the Eastern Orthodox Church. He is often depicted in art with symbols such as a winged man or angel, representing his Gospel's emphasis on the humanity of Christ. As the patron saint of tax collectors and bankers, Matthew's life serves as a reminder of the transformative power of faith and the call to follow Jesus, regardless of one's past.



THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER THIS WEEK

WEDNESDAY SEPTEMBER 24 Ember Day

An ember day is a time to remember those who are training for public ministry. So today we remember the group of Redruth lay worship leaders who trained recently and wait to be commissioned. We also remember Jason HJ in his second year of ordination training and Becca, Izzy, Isaac and Fr Christopher as they wait for a new direction on their journey of faith.



THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 25 Lancelot Andrews Bishop 1626

Born in 1555 in Barking, Lancelot was ordained and following several appointments was consecrated bishop of Chichester, and then translated to Ely and lastly Winchester. He was involved in church reform and the translation of the Bible now known as 'The authorised version'.



FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 26 Wilson Carlisle Founder of the Church Army 1942

Wilson was born in 1847 in Brixton. A spinal condition affected his education and led to a growing interest in religion. He was confirmed and worked with Moody and Sankey on their missions. Wilson was ordained in 1881 amd served at St Mary Abbots, Kensingron. He was troubled by the lack of contact between the church and the people, and began open air preaching in 1882. He resigned his curacy and founded the Church Army, four years after the founding of the Salavation Army.



SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 27: St Vincent de Paul Founder 1660
Born in 1581, Vincent was educated by Franciscans and ordained at 19. In 1909, Vincent resolved to devote himself to acts of charity. He founded religious communities and worked with falley skaves, war victims, convicts and others rejected by society. His communities became known as the Lazarists (men) and the Sisters of Charity.
