Dear Readers,

What is the history of the Harvest Festival?

The Harvest Festival tradition has its fertile roots in the Celtic beliefs that pre-dated Christianity in northern Europe. The importance of harvest, both practically as a source of sustenance for the community, and socially, was a keystone for the agrarian cultures of this time.

Festivals usually take place around the Sunday nearest the Harvest Moon, which is the full moon that occurs closest to the Autumn Equinox (often in the third week of September). This timing harks back to those earliest pagan origins, when most of the crops would have been safely brought in between the Celtic festival of Lughnasadh on 1 August and the Autumn Equinox.



GOSPEL FOR TRINITY 16 HARVEST John 6 vv25 – 35

THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER THIS WEEK

MONDAY OCTOBER 6 William Tyndale Translator Martyr 1536

Born in about 1494, William studied at both Oxford and Cambridge. Although wanting to translate the scriptures from Greek into English, the then Bishop of London objected. William went to live in Ger, any and never returned. His translation appeared in England in 1526. It was heavily criticised. William was arrested in 1535 and imprisoned in Brussels on charges of heresy. He died a martyr.



THURSDAY OCTOBER 9 Denys Bishop of Paris Martyrs 250

Denys, known as the patron of France was born in Italy in the 3rd century. He was sent to convert parts of France and established a church in the middle of the River Seine. He, and others died as martyrs and an abbey was built over their tombs.



FRIDAY OCTOBER 10 Paulinus Bishop Missionary 544

Born in the 6th century, Paulinus was one of the first missionaries to be sent by Pope Gregpry to convert England whilst working with Augustine. In about 627 Paulinus built the first church in York.



SATURDAY OCTOBER 12 Ethelburga Abbess of Barking 675

Ethelburga was the daughter of Erkenwald, the bishop of London. She was Abbess of a joint community in Barking, where monks and nuns shared facilities.
