
BISHOP HUGH

Bishop Hugh was consecrated in Lambeth Palace during COVID. Several watched that moment on television. He came to Cornwall as The suffragan Bishop of St Germans and next year will be translated to the Diocese of Worcester to be its diocesan bishop. **CONGRATULATIONS BISHOP HUGH.**

GOSPEL FOR TRINITY 17 Luke 17 vv11 – 19

The lepers were the outsiders and approached Jesus from a distance because, perhaps as society had rejected them, maybe Jesus would too. Sadly, maybe for some people, they wont approach the church because, for watever reason they wont fit in, wont be welcome, wont understand what's going on.

THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER THIS WEEK

MONDAY OCTOBER 13 Edward the Confessor King of England 1066 Edward the Confessor was king of England for 24 years. He earned his nickname because of his religious devotion and was later made a saint. His death in 1066 led to the Norman Conquest of England.



WEDNESDAY OCTOBER 15 Teresa of Avila Teacher 1582

(1515–82). Spanish nun St. Teresa of Ávila was one of the great religious women of the Roman Catholic Church. She is also known as St. Teresa of Jesus. She began a reform movement in the Carmelite order. The Carmelites are one of the four major mendicant orders (those professing poverty) of the Catholic Church. The Carmelite Reform restored the simplicity and contemplative character of early Carmelite life. St. Teresa was canonized, or declared a saint, in 1622. In 1970 Pope Paul VI elevated her to doctor of the church, a saint whose religious writings have special authority. She was the first woman to be so honored.




THURSDAY OCTOBER 16 Nicholas Ridley Hugh Latimer Bishops 1555

"The Oxford Martyrs" is an inspiring journey through the lives of Hugh Latimer and Nicholas Ridley, two courageous reformers who championed the Gospel during England's turbulent Reformation. From their initial encounters with Scripture to their unwavering stand for faith amidst persecution, this story illuminates the power of truth and the cost of obedience to Christ. Their legacy of boldness and sacrifice continues to ignite the light of the Gospel in hearts today.




FRIDAY OCTOBER 17 Ignatius of Antioch Martyr 107

St. Ignatius of Antioch was also called Ignatius Theophoros (in Greek, that means "God bearer"). His principal claim to historical fame comes from his martyrdom. Arrested by Roman authorities, he was sent to Rome for execution and, in the company of several soldiers, set out on the road to the Eternal City. Along the way Ignatius composed epistles (or letters) to the Christian communities of Ephesus, Magnesia, Tralles, Rome, Philadelphia, Smyrna, and a farewell letter to Bishop Polycarp. The Letters of Ignatius have long been greatly honored by the Church for their eloquent, detailed glimpses of the Church in Ignatius' era, and Ignatius' own spirituality.



SATURDAY OCTOBER 18 Luke the Evangelist

Luke the Evangelist was one of the four people who traditionally wrote the canonical gospels. These gospels tell the story of Jesus. Early Christian leaders believed Luke wrote both the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles. The New Testament mentions Luke a few times. The Bible book of Colossians (Col 4:14) calls him a physician. This means he was likely both a doctor and a follower of Paul. Christians have seen Luke as a saint since the early days of the faith. Many believe he was a martyr, meaning he died for his beliefs. The Catholic Church and other Christian groups honor him as Saint Luke the Evangelist. He is a patron saint for artists, doctors, and surgeons.



THE FIRST MILLENIUM SAINT / CARLO ACUTIS

Carlo Acutis (3 May 1991 – 11 October 2006) was an English-born Italian Catholic teenager known for his devotion to the Eucharist and his use of digital media to promote Catholic devotion. Born in London, England, and raised in Milan, he developed an early interest in computers and video games, teaching himself programming and web design and assisting his parish and school with digital projects.

Active in parish life, he served as a catechist and helped inspire several people to convert to Catholicism. He later created a website documenting Eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions. He was diagnosed with acute promyelocytic leukaemia and died at the age of fifteen. Since his death, his relics have been displayed in Assisi and his exhibitions on Eucharistic miracles have travelled worldwide.

In 2020, he was beatified by the Catholic Church after the Church recognition of a proposed 2013 miracle in Brazil attributed to his intercession, while a second miracle in Italy was confirmed in 2024. Acutis was canonised as a saint on 7 September 2025, alongside Pier Giorgio Frassati. Acutis has been referred to as the "patron saint of the Internet", "God's Influencer" and the "first millennial saint". [1][2][3]
