GOSPEL FOR EASTER SUNDAY: John 20 vv1 - 18 or Luke 24 vv1 - 12

Both of these readings focus on women being at the heart of the resurrection and being the first ones to carry the nedws of the risen Christ out into the world. It thus seems odd that women were historically on the edge of church ministry as Bishops, Priests and Deacons. Although it is now possible for women to hold these positions in the church, we wait to see if the next Archbishop of Canterbury will be a woman. Also, churches are still allowed to refuse the ministry of women, and are cared for by Bishops with 'alternative episcopal oversight'.



For those women who discovered that the stone had rolled away the future held the responsibility to bring that news into the world. On every Easter Day, it is valuable to consider which stones need to be rolled away in your life. If Easter means anything, it means that we must seek to embrace a new pathway, free from prejudice, violence and oppression. A pathway that embraces the love, hope and joy that Jesus brought into the world and made a reality through his risen life.
