The new Pope, Leo 14 chose his Papal name in honour of Pope Leo 13.

Perhaps Leo 13's desire for social reform will be a key platform of Leo 14's papacy.

Who Was Pope Leo 13?

Pope Leo 13, born Vincenzo Gioacchino Raffaele Luigi Pecci in 1810, became one of the most influential popes in modern Catholic history. He led the Catholic Church from 1878 until his death in 1903. Known for his scholarly approach, and progressive outlook, Pope Leo 13 navigated the Church through an era of immense social and political change. His papacy marked a significant shift in how the Church interacted with the modern world, particularly through his famous encyclical Rerum Novarum, which addressed the rights and conditions of workers. Throughout his papacy, Pope Leo 13 worked tirelessly to balance tradition with modernity, making his leadership a cornerstone of contemporary Catholic social teaching.

GOSPEL FOR EASTER 5: John 13 vv31 – 35

This Gospel reading comes within the context of what is now called 'The Last Supper'. Jesus has washed his disciples feet, indicating his role and our role as the servant of others. He then predicts his betrayal and Judas leaves the upper room. It is then that Jesus the world his overwhelmingly significant commandment: **Love one another, as I have loved you**. Jesus then goes on to tell Peter that despite his assurances, he too will deny him.

The pathway that Jesus sets before us all is a pathway of being a servant and doing what you can to love, support and care for others. To bring peace and hope into every situation and yet, to remember that it will not always go

well. There will be fear, danger, isolation as well as joy, excitement and fulfilment.

BUT, the pathway of love, although at times it may lead to a cross, will also lead to the wonder, glory and hope of the resurrection and to new life.



THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER DURING THE WEEK

MONDAY MAY 19: Dunstan Archbishop of Canterbury 988

Dunstan was born around 910 in Glastonbury. From a noble family he received an education that led him to the court of the King of Wessex. He entered the monastic life and focused on illuminating manuscripts, metalwork and music. In 943 the King appointed him Abbot and a great monastic revival followed. Dunstan gradually rose to political prominence and became Archbishop of Canterbury under King Edgar. He is reputed to have written the coronation oath. In 970 he fell from favour but continued as Archbishop.



TUESDAY MAY 20: Alcuin of York Deacon Abbot of Tours 804

From a noble Northumbrian family he was born around 735 in York. Educated in the Cathedral school he eventually became Master. In 781 he

went to advise Charlemagne and in 796 became Abbot of Tours. He became known for liturgical reform.



WEDNESDAY MAY 21 Helena Protector of the Holy Places 330

Helena came to power when her son, Constantine came to power in 306. Although abandoned by her husband, Helena's son raised her to power. As a Christian, Helena supported their cause and in 326 she made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Legend attributes the discovery of the true cross to her through a miracle. Three crosses had been found, but one healed a woman and hence was hailed as the cross of Christ.



SATURDAY MAY 24 John & Charles Wesley Evangelists 1791 1788

Born to an Anglican priest and a Puritan mother John had a spiritual experience in 1738 and began a travelling ministry with no parochial boundaries. After John's death in 1791 the world-wide Methodist Church was gradually formed. This led to Christian growth and mission in England.

Charles, travelling with his brother, he was determined that Anglican traditions should survive. He wrote numerous hymns which reflected God's saving love and the richness of worship.
