GOSPEL FOR THE SUNDAY AFTER ASCENSION DAY: John 17 vv20 – end There is a lot of talk about succession planning and legacy. This is exactly what Jesus is talking about in this reading. Although Jesus is talking prior to his Ascension, the church, through its liturgies has already moved on.

Through his teaching in parables and miracles Jesus prepared his disciples his followers to be his apostles. The ones who would go out into the world and continue the work that Jesus had begun. This would not be done in their own power. At Pentecost, the church remembers the descent of the Holy Spirit who empowered the first church leaders to continue the work.

This is what our Rector is seeking to do through the empowerment of the laity. Rector Rebecca, through the 'lay worship leaders' initiative is making it possible for the six worship settings to become stronger in their work with both the gathered and wider communities.

This work will begin in Christchurch at 9.30am when Linda and Mary will lead a 'service of the word'. A non-Eucharistic service where God's love will be proclaimed by lay people. This is an exciting development and may God's blessing and the power of the Holy Spirit rest on Linda and Mary and those who hear them.





ASCENSION PENTECOST THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER DURING THE WEEK

TUESDAY JUNE 3: The Martyrs of Uganda 1885 – 7 / 1977

In 1886, the Ugandan ruler, Mwanga order the persecution of Christians, especially children. They died singing hymns. Hardly a century later another ruler ordered the persecution of Christian leaders many of whom died as martyrs.



WEDNESDAY JUNE 4: Petroc Abbot of Padstow 8th Century

It is thought that Petroc was the son of a Welsh chieftain who on arriving in Cornwall founded a monastery in what is now called Padstow. He lived as a hermit, both at Padstow and Bodmin. Petroc is hailed as 'the Captain of Cornish Saints"



THURSDAY June 5: Boniface Bishop Apostle to Germany 754Born in Crediton, Devon in 675 he was ordained at age 30 and eventually sent to Germany where he was consecrated bishop. He annoyed pagahnsd by felling a sacred oak tree, but as the pagan gods remained silent there was widespread conversion. He founded monasteries and was finally murdered by pagans.



FRIDAY June 6: Ini Kopuria Founder 1945

As a policeman in the Solomon Islands, Ini's work led him to meet many people. He had a vision of Jesus and founded the Melanesian Brotherhood in 1925. This group grew in strength and its evangelical approach was a model for other communities.
