BISHOP HUGH

There is a date for Bishop Hugh's translation as Bishop of Worcester. The date is **SATURDAY JANUARY 17 2026 / 2.00pm**



Bishop Hugh was consecrated in Lambeth Palace during COVID. Several watched that moment on television. He came to Cornwall as The suffragan Bishop of St Germans and next year will be translated to the Diocese of Worcester to be its diocesan bishop. **CONGRATULATIONS BISHOP HUGH.**

Bishop Hugh baptised a young person (at Christchurch) and confirmed members of the Pencoys Church. He has shown kindness, compassion and understanding in endless pastoral situations. He has brought energy and enthusiasm to countless liturgies in many Cornish churches. All this as well as being the Bishop to the Armed Forces.

Bishop Hugh will be proclaimed as the Bishop of Worcester on Saturday November 28 at 5.00pm in St Mary La Bow in Stepney, East London

The Bishop's final service in Truro is on **SUNDAY DECEMBER 7 / 4.00pm.** This is a service of Evensong where Bishop Hugh will preach. ALL are welcome to attend. The Bishop will also read from St John's Gospel at the Cathedral Festival of Lessons and Carols on December 24 at 7.00pm

GOSPEL FOR THE FOURTH SUNDAY BEFORE ADVENT: Luke 6 vv20 – 31

This week's Gospel ends with the words: "Treat others as you would like them to treat you" (The New English Bible). If you would like to begin to understand what these words could mean to so many people, then listen to the sermon preached by The Rev'd Dr. Mark Oakley, the Dean of Southwark on Sunday October 26.

This Gospel, often called The Beatitudes, concerns how our Christian journey should react when there is challenge, need, bullying, name calling and so many other situations into which our journey will take us.

When the King, Charles III prayed with Pope Leo XIV centuries of persecution were rolled away. Their prayers cannot just remove the pain and suffering which so many experienced in the name of religion. However it can point the way to a new understanding, a new way to allow God's love to touch every corner of the world.

In the same way each one of must try to bring the unity and hope that this week's Gospel speaks of, so that all, whoever they are, may know that they are precious in God's sight.



THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER THIS WEEK

MONDAY NOVEMBER 3 FESTIVAL OF ALL SOULS (transferred)

The day in the year when the church remembers those whom we have loved, but see no longer. We give thanks for their lives, for the love which they brought into our lives and for their part in the Christian journey on earth.



THURSDAY NOVEMBER 6 William Temple Archbishop 1944

Archbishop of Canterbury from 1942-44, William Temple was a leader in the ecumenical movement and in educational, labour and social reform. He became headmaster of Repton School (1910-14) and rector of St James's Piccadilly in London (1914-17). Later he became leader of the 'Life and Liberty movement' which hugely influenced the shift towards synodical and democratic government in the Church of England. He was successively a Canon of Westminster (1919-21), Bishop of Manchester (1921-29), Archbishop of York (1929-42) and Archbishop of Canterbury (1942-4).



FRIDAY NOVEMBER 7 Willibrord of York Bishop Saint Willibrord was an Anglo-

Saxon bishop and missionary, known as the **apostle of Friesland**. He was born around 658 in Northumbria, probably near York, England, and died on November 7, 739, in Echternach, Austrasia. He is **a patron saint of the Netherlands and Luxembourg**. Willibrord was a pioneer among English missionaries who spread the gospel to non-

Christian peoples in Europe. He made his early studies at the Abbey of Ripon near York and entered the Benedictine Order.



SATURDAY NOVEMBER 8 The saints and martyrs of England

The 40 Martyrs of England and Wales were men and women who lived between the years 1535 and 1679, a time when being Catholic was not just dangerous—it was often a death sentence. After Henry VIII broke from Rome and established the Church of England, anyone who remained loyal to the Pope and Catholic teaching faced harsh penalties: fines, imprisonment, torture, and execution.
