There is a date for Bishop Hugh's translation as Bishop of Worcester. The date is **SATURDAY JANUARY 17 2026 / 2.00pm**



Bishop Hugh was consecrated in Lambeth Palace during COVID. Several watched that moment on television. He came to Cornwall as The suffragan Bishop of St Germans and next year will be translated to the Diocese of Worcester to be its diocesan bishop. **CONGRATULATIONS BISHOP HUGH.**

Bishop Hugh baptised a young person (at Christchurch) and confirmed members of the Pencoys Church. He has shown kindness, compassion and understanding in endless pastoral situations. He has brought energy and enthusiasm to countless liturgies in many Cornish churches. All this as well as being the Bishop to the Armed Forces.

Bishop Hugh will be proclaimed as the Bishop of Worcester on Saturday November 28 at 5.00pm in St Mary La Bow in Stepney, East London

The Bishop's final service in Truro is on **SUNDAY DECEMBER 7 / 4.00pm.** This is a service of Evensong where Bishop Hugh will preach. ALL are welcome to attend. The Bishop will also read from St John's Gospel at the Cathedral Festival of Lessons and Carols on December 24 at 7.00pm

GOSPEL FOR THE SECOND SUNDAY BEFORE ADVENT: Luke 23 vv33-43

This well known reading shows the complete contrast of the kingship of Jesus to the kingship of the world. Jesus, is clearly the servant king; ridiculed by the world and under the domination of the world forces.

Even as his life draws to a close, Jesus is able to listen and respond to someone in need offering reassurance, hope and a vision of paradise, the new kingdom.

This narrative is an icon of the Christian faith. A faith which calls upon each one of us to follow a pathway of forgiveness, compassion and acceptance. Urging people to recognise their need for God as they have God's love reflected to them

Today is the Festival of Christ the King, the day we celebrate the kingship of Jesus, a kingship which overturns the values so often seen in the world to being new life and a new hope.
