# GOSPEL FOR Epiphany 2 / John 2 vv1 - 11

This the first miracle that Jesus did is well known and is often used at weddings. It is a reading about trust, faith and transformation. The beleaguered bridegroom goes to Mary asking for help and she directs him to Jesus. But the solution is not what anyone expects. No hurried rush to the office licence, simply an instruction to use the ritual cleansing water. The transformation is immediate. The water becomes a reflection of God's love and power, something so wonderful that no-one had experienced before. So it is for us when the darkness and despair threatens. God's transforming love can enable each one of us to move from darkness into light as we acknowledge the saints who have gone before who embraced God's love on their own journeys.



# THOSE WHO WE REMEMBER DURING THE WEEK

# MONDAY JANUARY 20 Richard Rolle Writer 1349

Born in 1300 in Yorkshire he became a hermit at the age of 18 after giving up his education at Oxford. He settled as a hermit near the Cistercian nuns at Hampole. It was here, writing in Latin that he wrote much of his work which was venerated for centuries after his death.



# TUESDAY JANUARY 21 Agnes Child Martyr 304

Agnes was brave, faithful and resiliant beyond her 13 years. She is reputed to have refused an arranged marriage due to her devotion to Christ. Her example increased the cult of consecrated virgins and co-incided with the last Roman persecution under the Emperor Diocletian.



**WEDNESDAY JANUARY 22** Vincent of Saragossa Deacon Martyr 304 Vincent a Deacon was arrested with his Bishop Valerian. As they were questioned as to their faith, Valerian, due to a stammer could not be understood. Vincent spoke fervently for them both and condemned Paganism. He was immediately condemned to death.



**FRIDAY JANUARY 24** Francis de Sales Bishop of Geneva 1622 Born in 1567 Francis was educated in Paris and Padua, first in law and then as a Priest. He spoke against Calvinism from 1593 and in 1599 was consecrated as the assistant Bishop of Geneva becoming the diocesan Bishop in 1602. His work to establish the Roman Catholic Church in Geneva did not become a reality until 1799.
