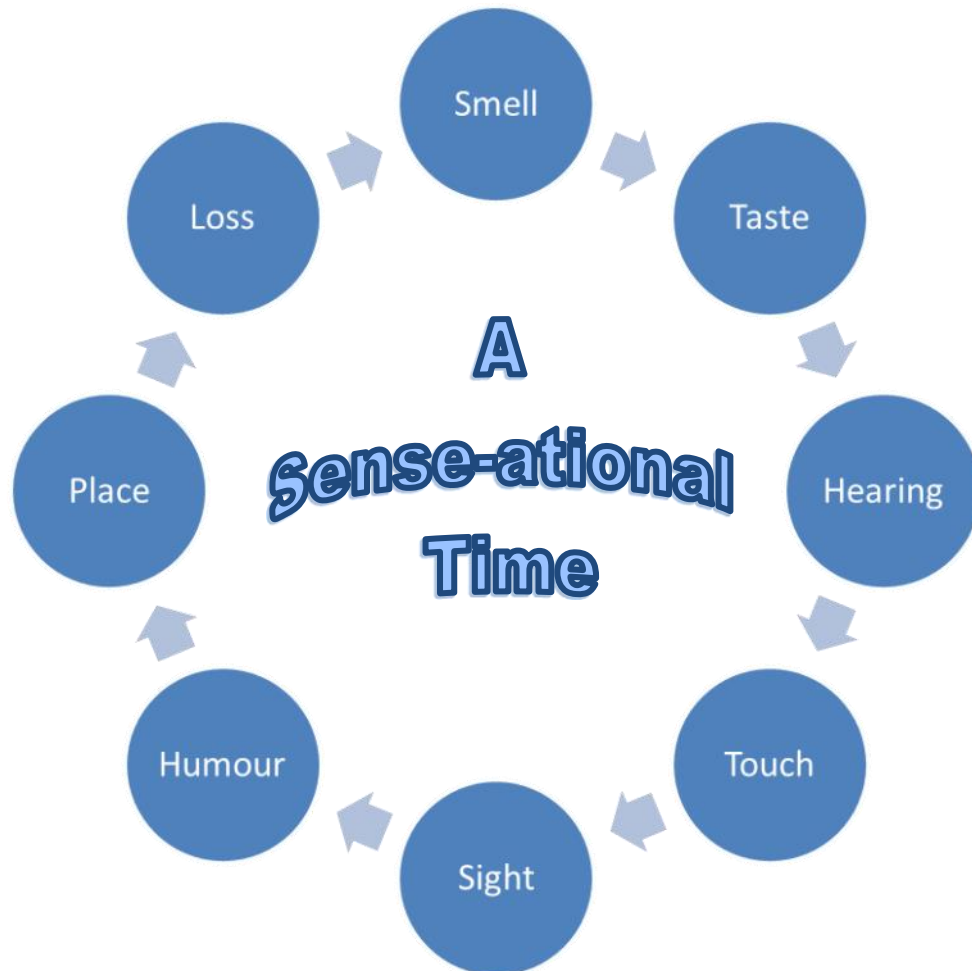


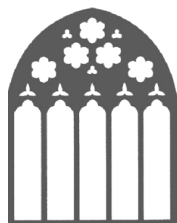

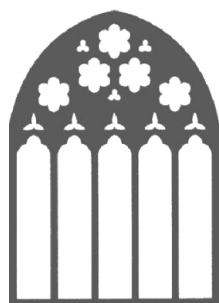

Photographers Jason Hoole-Jackson and Claire Wilson exhibit works showing both the visible and the hidden world around us.



Glass artists Mel Louis-Smith and Patsy Lawrence display examples of their different styles of glasswork. Mel’s includes her quirky birds, fish and picture designs in subtle blues, greens and whites while Patsy’s includes her coasters, window sun catchers



and wave designs in striking rainbow colours.



Dave Doble exhibits his beautiful wood turned items which are often made from reclaimed timber.

Cat Rowe displays her interesting and creative textile pictures and cards.



The "Crafty People" group display many of their wonderful handmade items. Mary Dacey brings her "Bags of Bags" selection to exhibit with a great choice of gifts for friends and family alike.

Cornish/Celtic Cakey Tea Ceilidh – Saturday 18th 12:00pm – 1:00pm

Hosted by the Lowender Peran Festival this is a fun filled hour for families of all ages. Come along and join in the dancing and the jollity.

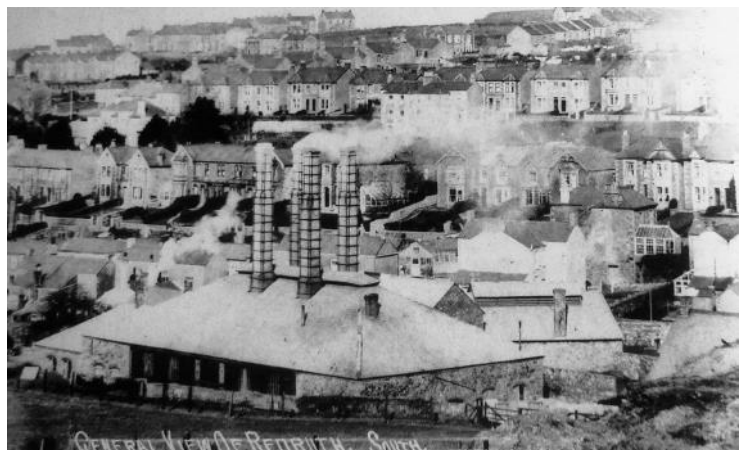
An Hour of Meditation and Reflection – Monday 20th 7:00pm – 8:00pm

Led by Margaret Saville, this is a chance to recharge your spiritual batteries and find some peace in our beautiful church.

Guided Walks "The Lost Mines" – Tuesday 21st/Thursday 23rd 10:00am – 12:00pm

Led by Linda Beskeen

Walk 1 – The lost mines of South Redruth – looking for clues in names and landscape. A walk from the church towards the south exploring the positions of the ancient Wheal Sparnon, tin streaming in the river, other mines of South Downs and West Carn Marth. Then back to church via



“Mount Pleasant”. Approximately 2 miles over 2 hours.

Walk 2 – The lost mines of East Redruth – looking for clues in names and landscape. A walk from church via Pedn-an-Drea to East End and Highway then returning via Cardrew. Approximately 3-4 miles over 2 hours, dependant on the weather.

“Pick your Brains, Pick a Number, Pick it Up” – Tuesday 21st 1:30pm – 3:30pm

This talk and art workshop led by Ruth Major and the Festival team is designed to engender a sense of caring for the place in which we live. Ruth will tell us how she set up a litter campaign in Manchester after the bombing 5 years ago to make her town a more pleasant place.

The workshop will challenge us to make a piece of artwork using discarded items, litter and reclaimed rubbish. All materials will be provided - including rubber gloves!

Dance Workshop – Tuesday 21st 7:00pm – 9:00pm

A two hour evening workshop led by Peter Fellows based around our theme of the senses. The evening will include a refreshment break and will finish with a chance for us to share our groupwork with one another. Please wear comfortable clothing. This is a free event but donations towards Festival costs would be appreciated.

“Poems, Pasties and Pints” – Thursday 23rd 7:00pm – 9:00pm

An evening of poetry for all on this year’s theme: The Senses. You’re invited to come along with one or two poems to share in a friendly get-together with a pasty (meat or vegetarian) which is included in your ticket price. If you write we’d love to hear one of your own poems, but most of us choose fa-

avourites old and new. It’s lovely to hear everyone read their choices, but we have readers who will happily step up if you prefer. Please interpret the theme as imaginatively as you like. Stumped for a poem? Come anyway and enjoy the readings. It’s a lovely chance to discover new poetry of all kinds.

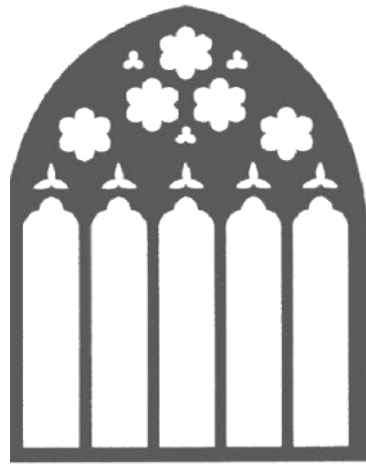


Booking is essential for this event. Tickets at £5 are available from lezss@btinternet.com. When booking please state your choice of pasty. Licensed bar available on the night.
